



For the past couple of weeks, the adults have been studying and discussing one of the most critically important issues that the church (both locally and universally) faces... namely, passing our faith in God and His Word to the next generations... our children and grandchildren. As many of you know, we began this focus by viewing a video report from Ken Ham of the Answers in Genesis ministry. Most of what follows here are some of the facts that Ken reported:

Statistics reveal a huge disconnect taking place between our children and their church experience...

Nationwide polls and denominational reports are showing that the next generation is calling it quits on the traditional church. And it's not just happening on the nominal fringe; it's happening at the core of the faith. Recent and irrefutable statistics are forcing us to face the truth. Respected pollster George Barna was one of the first to put numbers to the epidemic. Based on interviews with 22,000 adults and over 2,000 teenagers in 25 separate surveys, Barna unquestionably quantified the seriousness of the situation: **six out of ten 20-somethings who were involved in a church during their teen years are already gone.**

As the chairman of America's Research Group, and as a leading marketing research and business analyst expert, Britt Beemer specializes in studying human behavior. In the first scientific study of its kind, the "Beemer Report" reveals startling facts discovered through 20,000 phone calls and detailed surveys of a thousand 20–29 year olds who used to attend evangelical churches on a regular basis, but have since left it behind.

Of all the 20 to 29-year-old evangelicals who attended church regularly but no longer do so:

95% of them attended church regularly during their elementary and middle school years 55% attended church regularly during high school

11% were still going to church during college

Those who no longer believe that all of the accounts and stories in the Bible are true:

39.8% first had doubts in middle school

43.7% first had their doubts in high school

10.6% had their first doubts during college

The trends are frightening, but we plan to spend our study time for the next few weeks seeking answers and solutions that we can use to stop and reverse this... so that we can successful raise the next generation, not only to place their faith in God, but also to keep it throughout their lives and pass it on to the generations that follow! Plan now to use your Sunday evenings to prepare yourself for this mission.
