

WHO'S IN CHARGE HERE?

This past Friday, National Public Radio broadcast its daily episode of Fresh Air with Terry Gross. On that broadcast, Terry interviewed Jimmy Fallon, the current host of NBC's "Late Night" television program. Towards the end of that interview, the discussion turned to Jimmy's view of the church. Jimmy revealed that, as a child, he attended church often with his grandfather, who was "very religious." In fact, he also explained that he wanted to be a priest when he grew up. He said, "I just, I loved the church... I loved the feeling you get when you left church... I loved the whole idea of it."

Then, after being asked if he still attends, Fallon replied, "I tried to go back. When I was out in L.A., and I was like kind of struggling for a bit, I went to church for a while, but it's kind of, it's gotten gigantic now for me... There's a band there now and... you have to hold hands with people... now, and I don't like doing that... I mean it used to be the shaking hands... I don't want - there's Frisbees being thrown, there's beach balls going around, people waving lighters, and I go 'this is too much for me.' I want the old way... just like straight up."

After hearing his thoughts and experience, it reminded me of a story I heard several years ago about a conversation a church leader had with his neighbor over the course of several days.

The church leader asked his neighbor to attend church with him. The neighbor declined due to a bad habit that he could not overcome. The church leader told the neighbor not to let that stop him because his church would accept him. In the days that followed, the neighbor revealed other bad habits he had and the church leader encouraged him not to let those other habits deter him because his church would still accept him. Finally, the church leader learned that his neighbor started attending a different church. When the church leader asked him about it, he replied, "I was afraid that if I went to your church with my bad habits, God would not let me in heaven when I died."

Many people in this world have a similar perspective of the church and its purpose... it is simple and clear to them... and powerful! We see that power and impact of the Gospel when these same people have the opportunity to recognize the sin in their lives... and they realize that they do not have an answer for it... until they truly hear the Good News of Jesus (Romans 1:16). Many in the world respect the church when they encounter those who "live the Gospel" instead of trying to decorate or camouflage it.

Perhaps, in the efforts of several churches to "translate" the Gospel by restructuring their leadership roles and worship, the church has lost some of its meaning... and power... and people... like Jimmy Fallon and others! Perhaps it's time to be reminded that this "Christian" thing is real and that God is real. Perhaps we need to better understand that it's not "our church" that can save the world... it's God's church... the church of Christ... only He has the power to save (Acts 4:11-12). Perhaps it's time we began to ask Him to change our personal world, according to His will. Perhaps it's time we understand that our strength, our ideas, and our plans will not "get it done." Perhaps it's time we finally surrender... completely... to Him!
