



"In the beginning, God created the heavens and the earth"

These are the first few words of Scripture, and words which have created great controversy in recent years. For most of history, the human race has understood we were created by God. Although we may not have always understood the *how* or the *why* of Creation, we at least knew the *Who*. In the late 19th century, all that changed.

Although we can't lay all the responsibility at the feet of Charles Darwin, his book *The Origin of Species* (1859) helped popularize a view of life that did not require God for its genesis. The book was about natural selection of species, but implied that eventually species could dramatically change, given enough time. Initially controversial, by 1925 the Scopes trial allowed evolution to be taught along with Creation in public schools. The issue has been debated in American courts ever since. In 2005, a judge in Dover, PA ruled that creation could not be taught in the public school system as a possible explanation of life. During that time, newspapers and televisions were filled with discussions about the issue.

This issue is not going to go away, and it continues to be big news. One way that this issue has come around is through a very unlikely person and method. Ben Stein (of Visine commercial fame) wrote and performed in a movie that was released in 2008 entitled, *Expelled: No Intelligence Allowed.* The film explores the attempts by evolutionary scientists to suppress the large and growing body of evidence for creation. The movie is out on DVD and I encourage you to see it. It is powerful food for thought. For more details, http://www.expelledthemovie.com/.

The understanding of us as beings created by God in His image is foundational to understand who we are, and why we are here as human beings. The challenge of this truth represents an effort to remove God and our responsibility to Him from the public eye. This is yet another opportunity God has given to us to challenge the lies of the evil one and instead give credit to the Only One to whom credit is truly due.
