

"What Do You Hear?"

As October neared its final days this year, the world witnessed a taste of the potential power that this planet, on which we live, possesses. Just a couple of days or so before November and "All Saints Day" arrived, Hurricane Sandy slammed the Jersey shore and the isles of New York before flooding the lower sections of New York City and other nearby areas of the northeastern seacoast of our nation. By the time Hurricane Sandy concluded her march of domination and destruction, utility services were interrupted across 21 states, property damage estimates were calculated up to \$50 billion dollars (New York state estimated their losses at \$33 billion dollars), and more than 100 lives in 10 states were lost.

In the wake of this catastrophic weather storm and the continuous televised reports of its results, at least one heart among us heard the cries of the hurting who live in the region where Hurricane Sandy left her mark. One heart, filled with God's love, understood that He loves and cares for us all. One heart who believed, as ambassadors of Christ, we should take action... some way... to help our neighbors in need.

Within five days, a van was "filled to the gills" with a wide assortment of items and delivered to Centerville... and then, on to Staten Island... a remarkable result.. all because one heart listened and shared her burden with a friend.

Many times we hear about the troubles that have happened in this world and in the lives of our friends, family, and neighbors. Rarely, it seems, do we allow our hearts to listen in the way that Abigail Alka listened to the cries of those hurting souls on the east coast. What can we do to open our hearts to listen and respond to the opportunities we often have to demonstrate and express the love that God has given us through His Only Son, Jesus Christ?




