

When you think about it, it really makes sense that we celebrate a new year immediately following our celebration of Jesus beginning His life on earth in Bethlehem. In other words, just as Jesus brought us hope of a new life with God, the celebration of a new year often offers to us a practical measuring tool for evaluating the progress of our daily walk with Christ... and the depth of our hope and trust that we have in Him! As G. K. Chesterton put it, "Unless a man starts afresh about things, he will certainly do nothing effective. Unless a man starts on the strange assumption that he has never existed before, it is quite certain that he will never exist afterward."

Yes, we rejoice and celebrate the historical fact of the miraculous birth of Jesus over 2000 years ago and the hope we possess as a result. However, how empty does that celebration become if we fail to offer ourselves as His followers, His disciples? Yes, Jesus is the reason for the season, but He is the reason for every season in our lives. If we deny that fact with the choices we make in our daily lives, then Christmas becomes nothing more than another day off of our regular schedule

We have a church family filled with those who have sought to strengthen and deepen their faith and their walk with Christ... and we thank God for that example. For that reason, I want to encourage all of us to consider how we can use the beginning of a new year to help us continue to progress in our journey with Jesus, both individually and as a church family, during the next 12 months (if God permits).

Of course, one of the more practical ways that we can demonstrate or measure our progress is in our trust. How far do we trust God? Of course, many of us trust Him with our eternal salvation in Heaven. We do that because many of us understand that we have no power or control with that... only Jesus has defeated death. On the other hand, how far do we trust God with the issues of our life on earth?

Frequently, it seems, we have been tempted to believe that we have power and control over some things... and then we later learn differently. For example, just because we have the ability to plan our time schedule in advance does not guarantee that it will happen... only God knows what tomorrow will bring (James 4:13-15). Also, just because we can count the dollars in our bank account does not guarantee that we can know how much will be there tomorrow (or even later today!). (read Luke 12:15-31)

So, how far do we really trust God? Of course, planning our schedules and tracking our finances cannot be discarded as unnecessary. Those responsibilities give us the resources we need to help us gauge the progress of our journey. But, when there is not enough time or enough money to take care of our plans and ideas, what do we do first?... or when we do have enough time and money, what do we do first?... or before we make our plans, what do we do first? How far do we trust God?

As the new year arrives, let us evaluate individually and as a church family, how much... how far we trust God with our issues on earth. If we will take that step, I believe that, as the new year ends, we will see our trust in God strengthened... and, no doubt, we will also see His trust in us expanded, as well!

Speaking of trust, Cindy and I would like to express our appreciation for this church family entrusting us with the opportunity of serving you in the name of our Savior and Lord Jesus, the Christ. This past year has been another new adventure for us, to say the least. However, we have been blessed beyond words as God has continued to remain faithful according to the promises of His word through your love and generosity. Thank you!


