# Why Do We Study the Bible?

Even though you would probably respond quickly if someone asked for a reason to read and study the Bible, many of our friends and neighbors may still need a good answer. No doubt, the enemy has achieved much success in our country of convincing many that the Bible does not have any value for us in these modern times. However, if someone did ask you for a valid reason, what would you say? Perhaps your first thought might be to ask in response, "Why would you not read and study the Bible; after all, it is the Word of God, is it not?"

Recently, I found a series of articles written by Robert Velarde that addressed this question... "Why study the Bible?" Mr. Velarde is a former editor from the Focus on the Family ministry team and author of several books, including his most recent, "A Visual Defense: The case for and against Christianity."

In the first of these articles, Mr. Velarde listed eight of the most significant reasons he discovered from his experience that motivated him to study the Bible. His eight (8) reasons included the following: 1-to understand the world in which we live ("cultural literacy"), 2-to learn what the Bible actually says, 3-to be encouraged in facing and overcoming the struggles that this world gives us ("personal edification"), 4-to gain wisdom and knowledge that we may use to help others deal with their difficulties and problems, 5-to learn of Jesus and His mission, 6-to hear from God directly, 7-to know God better and His mission for us, and 8-to avoid real life and faith errors by learning the truth. That list may not include every reason you and I have, but it probably includes the ones that motivate

many, if not most of us in the body of Christ, to study the Bible. However, the important issues that this matter raises include identifying the primary reasons that will continue to motivate us to study the Bible. In addition, we need to identify the ones that will motivate our loved ones, who have not studied it, to begin to do so. In taking the time to specifically identify these reasons, not only will we be renewed in our efforts to study the Bible, we will also be prepared to properly encourage our loved ones to do the same.

In concluding these thoughts, please allow me to remind us of two related issues. First, please remember that our primary mission as learning-followers ("disciples") of Jesus, working together as a church family, is to disciple others... first, our families, and then, our friends and neighbors... by teaching them all that God requires of us (see Matthew 28:16-20). In other words, in order to share the word of God, we need to know it... and we cannot know it, unless we study it!

Second, in addition to our regular Sunday School and Worship opportunities each Sunday morning, please seriously consider taking time for additional study of God's word on six (6) Sunday evenings, beginning November 17, as we prepare to celebrate another anniversary of Jesus' birth. As we have already announced, there will also be opportunities each evening for the children to learn the same Bible lessons at their level of understanding. So, bring your family and invite your other friends and neighbors to use these special studies to get started with their own Bible studies... as we pursue our world-wide mission for God!
