Part of this trip involves attendance at the Bach Music Festival in Leipzig, a lifelong dream I've had.

I will miss you. I hope that you will work just as hard or harder when I leave because there is much work to be done. Part of that work involves preparing for your new pastor. You can make his/her job much easier if unfinished business is taken care of in the weeks ahead. Getting Range Line on a more solid financial basis is a part of that unfinished business. God gives us all that we need. The decision before each of us is how we allocate and use our God-given gifts.

While we will be separated by distance, we are still at one in our common ministry. Let us continue to serve God with joy and generosity.

Summary of May 20th Session Meeting

- The meeting was opened and closed with prayer by the Moderator.
- All minutes were amended and approved.
- Permission was granted for a pizza sale with proceeds going toward the Mission Trip.
- It was moved and seconded that the Session proceed to find and hire a Temporary Supply to fill
 the pulpit, moderate the Session and Congregational meetings, and to provide pastoral care until a
 designated pastor is called.
- It was moved and seconded that a pianist be secured from June 6 until Judy is able to resume playing and that he/she be paid an an agreed upon rate of between \$35 and \$50 per service.
- Approval granted for Bible School program during church service on July 11th.
- Pastor's mileage of 504 miles approved -- April 16-May 20.
- Treasurer's report and all committee reports received.
- It was moved and seconded to move funds from the General Savings Account to the Operating Fund since funds are very low.
- Because of economic strain, the purchase of the sign will be put on hold.
- Next Session meeting: June 17th.

OPERATING BUDGET AT VERY LOW EBB

Our pledges and non-pledged giving is not fully funding our daily operations at Range Line Church. Our operating budget is currently in the red. We need your help to keep up with our daily bills, mortgage payments, and to allow our committees to actually have some funds to do their work. The money that is given toward the operating budget is the most crucial money received because without it, we have no ministry.

Range Line and its entities have done a good job at raising money for special projects such as the mission trip, the ice machine, and Mission 52. These successes may have given a false sense of financial security. These funds, however, can only be used for the purposes that they are designated for, not for daily operations. We cannot use these funds to pay the light bill or the mortgage.

Designated Pastor Nominating Committee Report

The Designated Pastor Nominating Committee (DPNC) has begun meeting. We had an organizational meeting on May 12th. Darold Moore was elected chairman and Susie Hayden, Secretary. Other members are Glenda Hoots, Roger Parks, Katrina Slosser, Norma Lance & Matt Hayden. Our Committee on Ministry representative from Presbytery is Rev. Wayne Rhodes. We will be meeting on the next several Wednesday's to complete our first task of completing our Church Information Form (CIF). The process that we will go through is listed below. We will keep the congregation informed of our progress. Please remember that the committee has to keep things discussed in our meetings confidential, so don't be offended if you feel we aren't telling you everything.

PROCESS FOR CALLING A DESIGNATED PASTOR

G-14.0501g. A designated pastor, associate pastor, or co-pastor(s) is a minister of the Word and Sacrament approved by the committee on ministry to be elected for a term of not less than two nor more than four years by the vote of the congregation. The relationship shall be established by the presbytery. Such a pastor or co-pastor(s) shall be nominated by the congregation's pastor nominating committee only from among those designated by the committee on ministry of the presbytery. The congregation and the minister both must volunteer to be considered for a designated term relationship. Such a call may be established only with the prior concurrence of the committee on ministry of the presbytery. The terms of the call shall be approved by the presbytery. The minister shall be installed by the presbytery. When the minister is pastor, he or she shall be moderator of the session. The sections on calling and installing a pastor shall apply. (G-14.0502-.0507) (See G-14.0501a.) If there has been an open search process conducted by the committee on ministry and after two years of the designated pastor relationship, upon the concurrence of the committee on ministry, the designated pastor, and the session, acting in place of the pastor nominating committee for the single purpose of calling the designated pastor as pastor, a congregational meeting may be held to call the designated pastor as pastor. The session, with the concurrence of the committee on ministry, may call a congregational meeting to elect a pastor nominating committee to conduct a full pastoral search or to prosecute the call to the designated pastor to become pastor. The action of the congregation shall be reported to the presbytery. If the congregational action is affirmative, the presbytery, after voting to approve the new pastoral relationship, shall install the designated pastor as pastor.

- 1. The congregation completes a mission study, votes to establish a designated pastor position, and elects a DPNC (Designated Pastor Nominating Committee)
- 2. The Committee on Ministry approves the Mission Study and concurs with the will of the congregation to seek a Designated Pastor.
- 3. The DPNC completes a Church Information Form and following the approval of the Committee on Ministry, files it. Dossiers come, not to the search committee but to the Presbytery.
- 4. The Presbytery, through its Executive Presbyter and Committee on Ministry Chair, select appropriate dossiers for consideration and give them to the search committee. (Should one or more PIFs belong to a candidate for ordination, it should be understood that candidates can only circulate a PIF with the approval of their Committee on Preparation for Ministry. Only when a candidate has received a call can they be examined by the Presbytery for ordination.)
- 6. The DPNC selects the candidate from among the PIFs provided. Should they be unable to find a suitable candidate, they may ask the Presbytery for other PIFs.
- 7. The candidate is examined by the Committee on Ministry, then voted by the congregation. The Designated Pastor is installed in a service of worship and celebration by the Presbytery.
- 8. The call is for 2 to 4 years, after which time the congregation may choose to elect the Designated Pastor to fill the installed position, or the congregation may form a new PNC to seek a new person, or the position may be abolished.

To Rose, Thank you for the time and ministry that you have had at Range Line. We have shared in many joyful times and shared in our grief's. You have gently pushed us ahead to the time we face now, searching for our next called pastor. You have done your interim work well. We will miss you and wish you the best in your new call. Know that we will always be, Your family at Range Line.
