- Allen Dockweiler was in attendance with a report on all the work the Deacons are doing to help our congregation.
- Treasurer reported receipt of \$1021.00 from the Pork Chop Dinner. We would like to thank Men's Club and Dave Steiner along with are PW women for their work and support of our dinners. Range Line received a check for \$3,000.00 for our participation with the Lake County Fair ticket booths. Thanks to all who volunteered to cover a shift. A check will be written to Donald Straughen who was presented the Roger Reaber Scholarship this year.
- **WORSHIP & MUSIC:** Reported that Rev. Steve Blackstock declined an offer for temporary supply as they will be moving back to Colorado. Committee will be sponsoring a Coat Drive again this year. Motion from committee to move worship time to 10:30 as of September 12th was approved.
- **BUILDINGS & GROUNDS:** Water sample has been sent for regular testing. Committee continues with regular maintenance on our building. Joe gave an update on plans for the floor in the fellowship hall. Committee had no motions for this month.
- **FELLOWSHIP & MEMBERCARE:** Committee continues to help bring us together for fellowship on Sunday Mornings. Norma also brings us news from our Presbyterian Women and the great work that they undertake on behalf of our Church. Committee had no motions for this month.
- MISSION & EVANGELISM: Committee will be hosting the *REDCROSS BLOOD DRIVE* on August 28th. Please sign up to give your donation. Committee continues to work on Mission Projects and will be working on the Evangelism Sunday service on Sept 26th No motions from committee.
- **CHRISTIAN EDUCATION:** Committee is working on curriculum for Sunday School this fall. No motions from committee this month.
- STEWARDSHIP & FINANCE: We have a pending offer on the Manse. Committee reported the Masons refused to match the offer and Presbytery has approved the sale. Hopefully this will result in a closing on the property in the near future. Committee reminds all to be working on budgets for 2011 which should be ready by September Committee Meetings. No motions presented.

PRESBYTERY ASSEMBLY TO BE HELD AT GENEVA CENTER

Our Assembly Retreat September 17-18, 2010 at Geneva Center has a full docket. Besides anticipating our guest speaker, Rev. Paul Hooker from the Presbytery of St. Augustine, who will lead sessions on the Form of Government (nFOG) proposed by the 219th General Assembly, we will meet our General Presbyter candidate, conduct some key elections, review budgets and our own revisions to our governing documents, and examine Jody Noble for ordination to a call to Immanuel-Schererville. Registration for minister members and elder commissioners will begin September 1. Janet Moore is our elder commissioner. If you are interested in going with her, let her know.

DPNC COMMITTEE

The DPNC committee worked the first part of the summer on our Church information form (CIF) It was approved by the Presbytery Committee on Ministry (COM) in late July and went "on-line" shortly thereafter. Pastors are able to log into this site and look for positions that are open. With the designated pastor procedure, potential candidates will submit their Personal information form (PIF) to the General Presbyter. He along with the stated clerk of Presbytery and the Chairman and Vice Chairman of the COM will review them and send us three possible candidates that they determine to be a good match for our church. Our DPNC committee will then be able to interview these candidates, check their references and decide if we want to proceed.

Our last couple of meetings we have been working on questions to ask during an interview. Presbytery informed us that we should have our first three names very soon. Keep us in your prayers as we search for the next person to serve our church.


