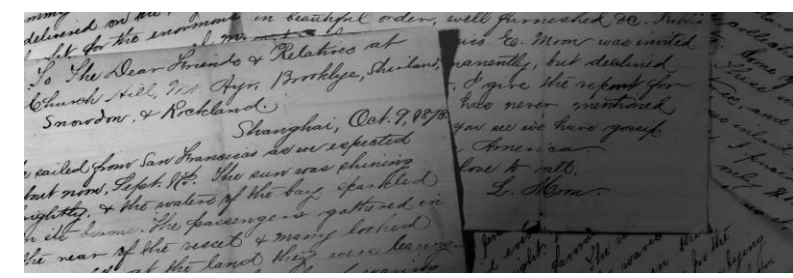

Tom's Thoughts

Our Annual Meeting of the Panhandle Baptist Association was a special night, and hosted by FBC Hooker. The Theme for the meeting was, **"One Body, One Spirit, Working Together."** This came from the word of the Lord to Zerubbabel, the civil leader of God's people in the days of Zechariah. *Zechariah 4:6 'Then he said to me, "This is the word of the Lord to Zerubbabel saying, 'Not by might nor by power, but by My Spirit,' says the Lord of hosts.'*

The evening began with a time of worship, led by Bro. Tom Huggins and a special song by Amanda Coffey. Bro. Orden Hartley called our annual meeting to order. New Pastors and Staff were introduced. We approved the business of the Association, new budget, new calendar, and the reports, and recommendations of the Nomination Committee.

Our special speaker for the afternoon session was Bro. Randy Caddell. His message was from Joshua 3:1-4. Randy reminded us of the necessary leadership of the Lord in the life of the Church and in the Association of local churches. God speaking through Joshua declared how the people of the Lord were to follow the Ark, the presence of the Lord, *'...that you may know the way by which you shall go, for you have not passed this way before.'* We, too, face a new way by which we will go, and we, too, have not passed this way before. Our world is changing, our Panhandle is changing. However the greatest need of men has not changed, the need dictated by our sin. Each man and woman needs a Savior. They need Jesus. As the Lord led the people of Israel, He will also guide us.

His message was followed by the gracious hospitality of our host church, with an awesome meal. After the fellowship and meal we reconvened for the evening session. Two churches were recognized with certificates by Baptist General Convention of Oklahoma for their gracious giving to the 2017 Annual Oklahoma State Missions Offering.

There was a second presentation to five churches of a picture of a bronze historical marker which had been given Tyrone Baptist Church. The marker provide the initial history of the church, and the initial history of the Beaver County Baptist Association. *Tyrone was the host to six Panhandle churches September 16, 1904, to organize the Beaver County Assn., the parent body of the present Panhandle Assn., formed at Goodwell, August 30, 1922.'*

They are, in order according to their dates of organization, Kenton (7/25/00), Garrett BC (3/13/03), FBC Texhoma (10/20/03), FBC Guymon (11/16/03), Goodwell BC (8/20/04). What remarkable heritage! For over 100 years, the faithful believers of these Southern Baptist churches have been faithful to the God's vision.

Our evening was closed with a special message by Bro. Trevor Bulls. His message was from Acts 6:1-4, with a focus on **v.6:4 '...we will devote ourselves to prayer and to the ministry of the word.'** Trevor, with these words, reminded us of the necessity for our faithful adherence to these two spiritual disciplines. - Mark Thompson led us in a devotional thought from II Tim. 4. We are “charged”; that is, we have been given the message, the tools and the Spirit to proclaim the Gospel. Mark then led us in prayer.
- Moderator, Orden Hartley, then called the meeting to order.
- Minutes from our May meeting were examined and Jeff Bradley moved their adoption with a second from Jerry Rice. The motion was approved.
- Financial reports from May through September were provided. Tom Freeman moved the adoption of each month’s report.
