## **Steve's Sentiments**

Evangelism (proclaiming the Good News to others who have not heard, or have not responded, with the hope that they begin a new life in Christ) is the heart of our vision statement: "to change lives" and our mission statement: "to seek people to be surrendered followers of Jesus." We pray for this to be the day-to-day experience in our congregation! But did you know that statistics have shown for years that the most effective way to evangelize is to plant a new church?

Our Cumberland Missions Ministry Team in Memphis has organized something called the **Builders Fellowship** in order to make it easy for each of us to be involved in new buildings, new church plants and fresh evangelism opportunities. Congregations, Sunday school classes, small groups and individuals can participate by joining the fellowship and committing

to up to three calls each year for a suggested commitment of \$50 per call and by offering prayer support for the work.



Read on to hear the latest call, issued March 2017:

Proceeds from this call are designated for the building program of Timoteo Apostol (Timothy Apostle) CP Fellowship in Quimbaya, Colombia--a large town of apx. 40,000 people located in the Coffee Region of Colombia in the Andes Mountains. Timothy Apostle CP Fellowship is a mission in the Andes Presbytery. It was started by a group of

youth and young adults of the CPC of Armenia called "Timothy Team" in 2002. This Fellowship currently has an average Sunday worship at-

tendance of 90 participants. They worship in a 100-year-old building in a working-class neighborhood. After an inspection, the pastor and steering committee were informed that the whole roof needed to be removed and some walls rebuilt in order to use the building again. The building project started in Oct. 2016.



#### **CHURCH CALENDAR**



Recently there have been some misunderstandings about how to get an event on the Cumberland church calendar. Below

are suggested steps to do so. If you have any questions, please don't hesitate to contact the church office. We will be happy to assist you.

How to get an event on the calendar: 1) Consult the appropriate online church calendar, eNews or bulletin calendar that will tell you of church activities that are already scheduled. Determine the best date/dates and location for your event(s). 2) Contact Joy Doles in the church office (792.3553 or joy@cpclubbock.com) to request that the dates, times and places be put on the agenda for the next staff meeting. Joy will examine calendars when she gets your request and determine if there are any apparent conflicts with the date. If there are conflicts, Joy will let you know about them so you can adjust your request. 3) At the next scheduled staff meeting, the requested event will be discussed, and, if there are no concerns about conflicts and if the content of the event is appropriate for the church (this applies to outside bookings), then the event will be placed on the calendar. (Outside events are not placed on our online church calendar.)

4) If a requested event will occur before the next staff meeting takes place, the pastor will determine if there are any apparent conflicts, and, if so, the session, ministry team leaders or any staff members affected will be consulted. The pastor may need to follow through with the approval process in place of the staff.

## TREASURER'S TALK

#### Which Type Are You?

A recent study of givers in a congregation indicated four types – gifted, thoughtful, casual, and reluctant.

- Gifted givers comprise two to five percent. The gifted giver does not need to be reminded of the obligation and joy of giving. Their primary calculation is "how much of God's money should I keep?"
- Thoughtful givers make up 15 to 25 percent. They
  need to be asked to give. The thoughtful giver is aware
  of God's call on all of life, possessions included. Their
  calculation is "how much of God's money should I give
  back to Him?"
- Casual givers are the largest group numbering 35 to 50 percent. They usually give in response to a specific request and give more out of obligation than joy. Their joy in giving is lessened by the consequences of parting with personal possessions. Their giving calculation is "how much of my money should I give?"
- Reluctant givers may represent a third of any congregation. They give very little of their resources. Their approach to giving is "my money is my business."
