

#### French Fries Teach A Lesson

A father driving home with his son after dinner asks, "Son, what would make you happy right now?" His son responded – "Fries." The father replied "But we just ate!" His son replied, "Dad, you asked – fries." Stopping at McDonald's, Dad ordered the largest fries on the menu. With fries overflowing on the tray, his son dove into more fries than he could ever eat.

After watching his son enjoy his fries, Dad decided to have a fry too. When Dad reached for a fry, his son wrapped both his arms around all the fries and said sternly, "Don't touch my fries!" Dad was shocked. Here he had freely purchased and given ALL the fries to his son, and now his son tells his dad to back off. Sound familiar?

Could this story represent our relationship with God and how we view our possessions? God freely gives us everything we have (often in great abundance), and our response when He asks us to give is—Back off! We essentially tell God, "I'll decide when and how many fries to give you, if any at all."
