"Knowing he felt this way, I reached for something special just for Mike. The inspiration came watching our son wrestle at a non-league match against a team sponsored by an inner-city church. When I watched the other team wrestle without headgear.

"That afternoon, I went to a local sporting goods store and bought an assortment of wrestling headgear and shoes and sent them anonymously to the inner-

city church. On Christmas Eve, I placed the envelope on the tree, the note inside telling Mike what I had done and that this was his gift from me. His smile was the brightest
