Steve's Sentiments

My current sermon preparation has got me thinking and praying a lot about a healthy Body of Christ – one in which good Biblical nutrients are regularly consumed and digested, with skin that is making contact with the needs of the world, the cells all knowing and doing their part. A healthy body responds instantly to the impulses coming from the brain (Jesus) and the refreshing oxygen (Holy Spirit) renews our cells 24/7.

These ideas have drawn me to two books on my shelf: *The Healthy Church* by C. Peter Wagner and *Turn-Around Churches* by George Barna. Like a diagnostician for maladies afflicting churches, Wagner points out nine diseases that seem to distress the Body of Christ. One he describes is hypopneumia (hahy-poh-NOO-mee-uh). Hypo indicates a deficiency in something and pneumia is the word for "breath or spirit." In layman's terms, Wagner has discovered that while many churches and people acknowledge the existence of the Holy

Spirit, their daily life reflects a deficiency in reliance upon His constant refreshment of fruit, power and gifts.


Barna reports that in many cases, churches seeking new life and health often turn to organizational changes because that's what organizations in the

world do - they redefine their mission or restructure their personnel. Barna says, instead, they need to think like an organism and consider the health of their cells. What they need is greater individual health of their members brought about greater bv healthy reliance upon the Holy Spirit.

Our preoccupation, if you will, should be to seek more of the

Holy Spirit's fruit (love, peace, patience... Gal. 5:22-23), power ("God has given us a spirit of power... II Tim. 1:7) and gifts (We have been given gifts... Rom. 12:6). *Dependency upon the Holy Spirit and prayer are inseparably linked.* That prayer must involve

you and me! As Barna points out: "It is not enough for the pastor to pray fervently, nor is it sufficient for a leadership team to pray ardently on behalf of the congregation. Until the church owns prayer as a world-class weapon on the battle against evil and cherishes prayer



as a means of intimate and constant communication with God, the efforts of a body are severely limited, if not altogether doomed to failure."

Join me as we seek God's life in us through prayer on Thursdays at 1:00 or 6:30.

A Look Back

The term "per capita" expresses an average for each person. Per capita is useful in measuring the significance of a particular value. The total number of people in a group is determined first. In the case of a church, this could be average weekly attendance for a year. The next step is to determine the amount for which a per capita measure is to be calculated. For a church this could be Sunday offerings. Divide Sunday offerings by average weekly attendance to determine per capita giving.

For 2013 the average per capita giving at Cumberland Presbyterian Church was \$2,836. This was a 17% increase over 2012. In the 8 years between 2006 and 2013, per capita giving was the highest in 2013 even though the attendance was lower than in earlier years. Comparing per capita giving for the years 2006 – 2013 indicates that although attendance is lower, giving on a per capita basis has increased substantially.

The generosity of a smaller number of people continues to bless those touched by the ministries of Cumberland Presbyterian Church.


