Steve's Sentiments

Do You Hear What They Hear?

One of the messages that came through to me personally over this past Christmas season is how readily God communicates with His people. He communicated with Zachariah that he would father a prophet named John (the Baptist); Elizabeth knew, through a revelation of God, that the baby Mary was carrying was Elizabeth's Lord; God visited Mary, via an angel, to let her know she would have a baby named Jesus; God spoke to Joseph in a dream telling him the significance of this baby and urging him to stay with Mary; God invaded the shepherd's field with angelic announcements of Jesus' birth; God told Simeon, through the Holy Spirit, that Simeon would not die before seeing the Messiah in his lifetime. Does this not make you wonder if God wants to **communicate** with us more today?

First Samuel 3 and verse 1 tells us that in the days of Samuel, "...Word from the Lord was rare in those days, visions were infrequent." There are times when direct communication from God wanes. Why is this? This chapter in 1 Samuel demonstrates just how out-of-practice the priest Eli was at listening for God. Maybe we don't hear from God because we are not listening. Zachariah heard God while serving and praying in the temple; Elizabeth, righteous and walking blamelessly with God, heard Him at home; Mary, a devoted bond-slave of the Lord, heard and was ready to do whatever the Lord would say; Joseph heard the Lord while resting; Simeon seemed to be perpetually attuned to the Holy Spirit.

As 2012 approaches and is upon us, who will join me at making an effort to position ourselves such that we can hear a word from the Lord and see visions? Peter said in a sermon (Acts 2:17) that we are now in a period of time where our sons and daughters will prophesy, our young men will see visions, and our old men will dream dreams. My prayer is that in this year 2012, sons and daughters, men and women, young and old will step up and we will see an increase in our reception to God's communication with us!


