Steve's Sentiments

Who was the Master thrilled with when He came back in the *parable of the talents* (Matt. 25:14-30)? The pragmatist.

Dictionary.com defines pragmatist as "a person who is oriented toward the success or failure of a particular line of action, thought, etc.; a practical person." I think that if we understand the concept of being a pragmatist, we can better understand Jesus' parable. In fact, in Luke's account of a similar parable, the one giving the "talents" (literally "funds") tells the recipients to "pragmatize" with these funds; the NASB translates it "do business" (Luke 19:13). To "pragmatize" means to use the funds in such a way that there is success demonstrated by increase in the particular line of action or thought.

I would like to propose that in 2013, we "pragmatize" with the resources our Master has given us. I am suggesting that we evaluate

our efforts, programs, services, ministries, expenditures, initiatives, etc. by the success or failure of these activities to bring increase in the purposes of the church. *The Church on Target* by Joe Ellis, calls these activities the "Kingdom Enterprise." We are a church on purpose and our Master is eager to see increase in His Enterprise: the redemption of the people of our world.

What does success in this enterprise look like? According to the Great Commission (Matt. 28:19-20) it looks like people becoming disciples, people being welcomed for the first time into faith in Jesus, people learning to walk with Jesus in obedience and freedom. According to the Great Commandment (Matt. 22:37-40), success looks like people loving God with passion, sincerity and common sense, and people loving and doing for others as they would do for themselves.



Let's be a church on purpose! Being a pragmatist does not mean uncaring, it means exactly the opposite – caring enough to make sure that our recourses are hitting the target and resulting in more people living, loving, serving, giving, growing, proclaiming, discipling, and worshiping. When the Master came back, he was thrilled with the steward who "pragmatized!"
