Steve's Sentiments

It is time to think about leadership opportunities at Cumberland Church. Do you know that presbyter is the Greek word for elder? So, as you can imagine, selection of elders is a big deal in a church with "elder" in its name. "Elder" is really synonymous with "shepherd" and "pastor." Some assume elder infers "old" but it is more accurately a reference to a person's ability to offer sensitive pastoral care and quality spiritual oversight to a growing flock of believers. To understand their significance, look at how when Paul planned churches he didn't appoint pastors and leave them in charge, he appointed elders! (Acts 14:23)

We also are looking for deacons. "Deacon" means "servant;" and while that is a description of every Christian, there is a special classification of deacons described in Acts 6 who were especially attentive to sharing leadership with elders—particularly in the area of meeting physical needs related to the poor, elderly, widows, orphans, imprisoned, etc. Some assume that our deacons are a pool of "worker bees," but, while they are certainly workers, they are charged with leading teams of workers within our congregation.

This is also the time to consider leaders for our standing ministry teams. These standing commissions include important ministries like Christian Education, Evangelism, Fellowship, Finance, Missions, Personnel, Property and Worship. These leaders will have outstanding passion for that particular ministry with spiritual gifts that lend themselves to effective leadership and accomplishment of the ministries' purposes.



Flower Ministry by Edie Fanning

Did you know that Cumberland deacons have a flower ministry? The purpose of this ministry is to provide visitation to those who are in the hospital. It is an opportunity for deacons on rotation to fulfill our charge to "minister to the sick and others in need" and to provide a flower and words of encouragement to those who are hospitalized. The ministry is in keeping with the teachings of Jesus Christ, who came to serve and not to be served. A deacon on rotation is designated as the monthly "Flower Deacon". When our church staff learns of members or friends who are hospitalized, the "Flower Deacon" secures a flower and visits the person in the hospital on behalf of Cumberland Church.

Communication is the key! If you learn of someone in the hospital, please notify the church office as soon as you can so that we won't miss an opportunity to minister to those in need.





Wednesday: Each day began with devotionals; this evening was worship and communion--the message from 1 Corinthians 9:19-23 by Rev. Walker on "THE POWER, PERSUASION, & PROFIT..."

2NO-U Event Unifies & Challenges









TREASURER'S TALK By Richard Trussell

A New Look

The monthly stewardship report has a new look. The focus of the report will be actual income and actual expenses.

Expenses in the 2012 budget were not fully funded by budgeted income. Budgeted income was based on past giving trends. Budgeted expenses were based on ministry programs currently in place. Receipt of additional contribution income is needed for these expenses. Amounts will continue to be reported on a monthly and year-to-date basis. The year-to-date totals provide a way to analyze the past and predict future trends.

Sunday offerings are collected during the three worship services each Sunday. Other income includes memorial donations, rental fees charged for use of the building, the monthly lease paid by Southcrest Christian School, etc.

The May report indicates that offerings of \$97,836 were needed for January - May to cover budgeted expenses for that same period. Offerings received of \$94,713 were \$3,123 less than expenses at the end of May.
