Steve's Sentiments

Psalm 34:8 says, "Taste and see that the Lord is good." Our relationship with God is something to be **experienced.**

Worship is not just a mental exercise we go through, it is an opportunity to get engaged with God and experience His goodness. VBS isn't just about learning *about* God, it is about letting children experience the love of God through His loving people. We don't study the Bible to know the Bible, we want to know the God of the Bible.

Tony Evans has illustrated this truth well: "When you go to a restaurant, they give you a menu. The menu says what a particular restaurant at a particular location offers to eat. Now, you can read a menu and get real hungry. Even though your original hunger may have led you to the restaurant, a menu can make you feel like salivating. You hear lots of people say as they review their choices, 'Mmmm, that looks good.'

"Then you have somebody who comes and proclaims the menu to you. A server then exegetes the menu. They expound on the menu. They take you through the menu. They describe the menu. Then they have a Q and A session by asking if they

can answer any questions about the menu. So a restaurant patron can read the menu and hear about the menu, but they don't then say 'amen' and go home. They don't leave the restaurant talking about how great the menu was or how great the waiter did explaining it. That is not the reasons why



you came. You didn't come to read about it nor did you come to just hear somebody describe it. You came to *experience* it. So until you've eaten, you're not through.

"Many people are satisfied to come to church to read from the 'menu', to have somebody describe the 'menu', and then go home not having partaken of the meal and still being hungry."

Wow, Evans has a great point! If we

don't "taste", we won't "see." We taste by thrusting ourselves in faith into God's hands and His control. Only then, when we have placed ourselves in God's hands and taken our hands off the controls, can we "see" that the Lord is truly good and trustworthy, loving and powerful. This is how our faith

grows – by experiencing *God's* faithfulness to us. If you trust God with your finances in a small way, you learn that He can be trusted in bigger ways; if you trust God to control your relationships with others in small ways, you learn that He can be trusted in all of your relationship challenges. If you trust Him by speaking up for Him, when prompted, you learn that you can trust Him with more challenging opportunities to witness for Him.

"We are blessed if we take refuge in Him" says the rest of this verse. This place of refuge is not an ironclad "safe-room" in which we are isolated from the world. This refuge

is "<u>in Him</u>." "He is invincible, impenetrable, and unable to be bribed or coerced. He does not grow weary or impatient with my need for protection. His protection is relentless, His provision is abundant, His shelter is warm, and His loyalty is promised" (quoted from David Gunderson). The Church that Jesus builds tastes and sees that the Lord is good. Let's all eat the Chef's recommendations!

Training will be provided as needed to perform specific tasks.
