From the Deacon's Bench

One of the outreaches that the deacons support is making food donations for hospital food bags. On May 12, my sister and I met Trine, Director of the food bank's External Relations, at Sam's Club. She is in charge of the hospital boxes (bags) as well as many other aspects of serving the South Plains Food Bank (SPFB). She had selected items for the bags and all I had to do was to ok her selections and pay for them. We kept adding items until the total was \$515.18. We paid for the items, and off Trine went with two baskets of food for the food bank. We (CPC) bought many single serving boxes of fruit, cereal, raisins, Vienna sausages, mac and cheese, soup, ravioli, pudding, applesauce, etc. When I had called earlier the first need she mentioned was fruit.

As you may know, the hospital bags are given to people who are staying with someone at the hospital and need to eat. The hospital staff has charge of the bags. Some of these bags are also for people who need food but have no cooking facilities. Trine told me they had been able to provide a single mother and her small child some of this type of food. I wanted to cry that a mother and her child were without food. I'm so glad we could help.

Don't forget the South Plains Food Bank's Summer of Sharing Food Drive which has already started and ends June 30 with a Wrap Up Rally. We have set out boxes at the church to collect nonperishable food beginning now and going through June. Your generous donations are appreciated!

CPC Summer Cinema Series




