Before purchasing a card or a gift, you might spend some time considering his clothing needs, habits, hobbies, likes and dislikes, etc. But what about our heavenly Father? Is there something we can give God this Father's Day? Below is blog I found online by Debra Pedrow. Maybe she can give us some ideas for a Father's Day gift for God this year....

Because God is busy 24/7 I could buy Him a Joseph-like robe to relax in, but it still would not compare with the robe He already owns! The LORD reigns, He is robed in majesty; the LORD is robed in majesty and armed with strength; indeed, the world is established, firm and secure (Ps. 93:1).

Any clothes I offer the Father would look dull compared to the grandeur of His present magnificent wardrobe. Praise the LORD, my soul. LORD my God, You are very great; You are clothed with splendor and majesty (Ps. 104:1).

Some would think a practical device He could use on specific occasions would make a good gift--like the gift of a handheld flashlight to help Him through the night. But why should God bother carrying an object when He is self-sufficient as His own established light source? The LORD wraps Himself in light as with a garment; He stretches out the heavens like a tent (Ps. 104:2).

A stylish silk vest, fashionable felt hat or trendy top coat could be used to keep the Father warm. But more precious than any designer wardrobe is righteousness, salvation, vengeance and zeal, which already adorn Him. He put on righteousness as His breastplate, and the helmet of salvation on

His head; He put on the garments of vengeance and wrapped Himself in zeal as in a cloak (Is. 59:17).

Can it be that God is just one of "those peo-

ple" we equate with being "hard to buy for"? After all, He is the Maker of all things and can create what He wants when He wants it! In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth (Gen. 1:1).

Anything we could possibly give to God will not be new to Him, right? He set all things in motion which includes everything here on earth. The earth is the LORD's, and everything in it, the world, and all who live in it; for He founded it on the seas and established it on the waters (Ps. 24:1-2).

And everything includes what is in the earth. We can forget about

giving God something expensive like silver goblets or gold coins, because those also are already in His possession. 'The silver is mine and the gold is mine,' declares the LORD Almighty (Hag. 2:8).

Not only can we not give God anything new materially, but we cannot even buy Him a spacious acre of land on which to rest His feet because He already owns that too! The land must not be sold permanently, because the land is mine and you reside in my land as foreigners and strangers (Lev. 25:23).

So what do we give the Father who has everything?

Actually, God already gave us His giftwish-list through the prophet Micah. He has shown you, O mortal, what is good. And what does the LORD require of you (Mic. 6:8)?

- To act justly.
- To love mercy.
- To walk humbly with your God.

Some 2758 years ago God wanted positive action from the people and as is God's way – nothing has changed! God still desires our gift to Him to be the offering of love. And even though Micah told us exactly what God wanted, God still reminded us again when He lovingly sent Jesus to exemplify the meaning of the gift of love. And 2000 years ago Jesus Christ came to the world to show exactly how we should:

Act justly.

- Love mercifully.
- Walk humbly with our God.

This is what God wants from us not just on Father's Day but on each day of the year.

The **Session** will meet Mon., June 19, 6:30 in the Library. Don't forget to pick up Session packets on Sun., June 18.



Today's effective churches continue to encourage and prioritize fellowship as an important part of the gathering of the saints.

Fellowship is the grease that keeps relationships in the church growing. The number one factor influencing a guest's decision to return is "the friendliness of the people." One study found that the average new member who joined a church and remained active had made seven new friends in the church during that first year. The average dropout had made an average of just 2 friends.


