Which Congregation Are We?

Is the destiny of a congregation God's business or the congregation's? Did you know that the Lord has called us to join HIS enterprise, not vice-versa? But whether or not we stay on the Lord's path for us is OUR business. The prophets Jeremiah and Isaiah gave us snapshots of the same congregation at different times in history – and the perspectives are so different, that it seems like two different congregations.

Jeremiah 2:5-6 records the LORD saying this to His people: "What injustice did your fathers find in Me that they went far from Me and walked after emptiness and became empty? They did not say, 'Where is the Lord who brought us up out of the land of Egypt, who led us through wilderness..." The startling thing about this Scripture is

that God's people walked away from the presence of the Lord; they either didn't realize that God's presence was gone, or they didn't care! Verse 6 says they didn't even think to ask, "Where is the Lord?" Did this congregation get too comfortable with "business as usual"? How could they forget to seek God's presence & power?



Isaiah gives us another snapshot of this congregation in Isaiah 63:11. After a period of time of rebelling and grieving the Holy Spirit and suffering the consequences of God withdrawing His presence from them, this is how the congregation responded: "Then His people remembered the days of old, of Moses; 'Where is He

who brought them up out of the sea with the shepherds of His flock? Where is He who put His Holy Spirit in the midst of them...?" The congregation realized this time that their existence wasn't even close to matching what God told them they should experience – that is, the power of God at work among them and

leading them.


These options are ours today. Are there those among us who notice and care that our existence as a congregation of God's people is lacking when compared to what RESENCE lacking when compared to what the Bible describes as normal? Are there those among us who are crying out in prayer, "Where is the God of power and action, changing people's lives from darkness into light? From hopelessness into joy and purpose?" I hope so!

Our sermons this month through June 8 will deal with this question: Do we want more of God's power in our lives, and are we willing to admit our desperate need for Him? May God deal openly with us as we submit to Him!

TREASURER'S TALK

What Goes Up and Stays the Same?

This question can be answered with two words – interest rates. Rising interest rates have been the talk of Wall Street and Main Street for months. But not all rates are rising. The rates you earn on your savings accounts and on money market funds haven't budged, and that's not expected to change. That's because short-term rates are anchored by the Federal Reserve's monetary policy.

Short-term rates have been set at nearly zero since 2008, and the Fed has said it will stick with its strategy until unemployment falls below 6.5% which isn't expected until 2015. Longer-term rates, however, are driven by the market – that is, bond buyers and sellers. As the economy improves, long-term rates will rise.

Interest rates on money market accounts, savings accounts, and shorter-term certificates of deposit will not climb much this year, if at all. There is one strategy to overcome these low short-term rates. Average yields can be boosted without locking in low rates by "laddering" CDs with maturities of one to five years. This will produce average yields ranging from 0.22% to 0.79%.


