Many of us church members have lost the Biblical understanding of what it means to be a part of the body of Christ. We join our churches expecting others to serve us, to feed us, and

to care for us; and we don't like the hypocrites in the church, but we fail to see our own hypocrisies.

This study is a journey of rediscovering the privilege and joy of church membership, a journey through six pledges which are about the joy of being last instead of first, the joy of being a unifier rather than a complainer, the joy of being a servant rather than being entitled. - 3. To avoid insisting on personal preferences and desires, and to put up with associated inconveniences.





TREASURER'S TALK

Disappearing Generosity?

A pastor told the story of his childhood, watching his mother write out tithe checks as his father drove them to church <u>every</u> Sunday. He then presented a scary statistic: the average churchgoer attends church just 1.7 times a month now. And as a result, the general culture of generosity has been on the decline.

At the end of the 2013 holiday season, Amazon revealed the startling fact that 60% of their holiday shopper activity had come from a mobile device. What if 60% is somehow tied to the disappearing culture of generosity? One church decided to test this theory.

Individuals were split into three groups based on their past giving habits:

- Regular Givers: Those who give at least once a month
- Intermittent Givers: Those who gave one to two times a quarter
- New Givers: Those who never gave
 After three months using a mobile giving app
- Regular givers averaged giving \$49 more per month
- Intermittent givers averaged giving \$76 more per month
- Brand new givers averaged giving \$143 more per month

This study indicates that generosity still exists once a new set of tools were made easily available.
