Steve's Sentiments

Committee Work or Ministry Work?

To me, there is a huge difference working on a committee and working for a ministry. There is nothing wrong with serving on a committee. In fact "committee" is a good word meaning "one(s) who is(are) committed." And "commit" implies coming together for a mission – could be exciting! However, committee work also has some stigmas: "I don't want to get stuck on a committee that I can't get off"; or "Committee meetings are Bo-o-o-or-ring!" Then there are jokes like, "If Jesus Christ Himself wanted to get anything done around a church, even He would have to go through the right committee!"

I am suggesting a name change in how we get things done around here. Instead of committees, I want us to think about ministry teams; instead of committee chairs, I want us to think about servant leaders; and instead of committee members, I suggest we think of ministry team members. Just an exercise in semantics, you ask? I don't believe so. Ephesians 4:12 explains that leaders in the church have the responsibility to equip the saints (all of us) for "the work of ministry." All that each of us does around here is (or should be) ministry-oriented. It fulfills I Peter 2:9 which says we are all "priests" (ministers).

The Worship Ministry Team serves to create engaging worship of our Almighty God. The Property Ministry Team sees that our facility is functional and maintained to enhance ministry. The Finance Ministry Team monitors our stewardship of resources God provides. The Christian Education Ministry Team assures that quality growth opportunities are available and accessed. The Personnel Ministry Team sees that we have the right people with the right gifts serving in the right places. The Fellowship Ministry Team creates an atmosphere of love, hospitality and Christian concern at events and within relationships. This is not an exhaustive list, as God is doing much more and will do more in the future. We can always develop more ministry teams to meet needs.

I hope you will consider serving on a Ministry Team. It is the natural progression of worshiping here and helping achieve our mission: to seek, nurture and equip people to be committed disciples of Jesus Christ. More details are on our website for how to get involved. $\sim \text{Steve}$

TREASURER'S TALK By Richard Trussell

A New Way to Give

Recently The Chronicle of Philanthropy reported new research on the demographics of online giving. According to a new study of more than 17,500 donors, most people, regardless of age, now prefer making charitable contributions online. The survey found that more than half of donors who are 65 or older now prefer to make their gifts online. Much higher percentages of younger donors said the same thing. It was the first time in three years the survey has been conducted that a majority of donors in all age groups said they preferred to give online. Two-thirds of donors wanted totally electronic communications.

Churches that don't offer online giving suggest a primary reason they don't is the lack of interest or participation in online activity by older members. In the 2011 State of the Plate report, 30 percent of the more than 1,500 church leaders surveyed said they accepted donations through their websites during 2010. Interest in electronic communications, such as e-newsletters appears to be growing among seniors.
