

If you missed the announcement last week, we are going to test a new worship service schedule here, at Cumberland Church. Last year we added a third service that starts at 9:45 with an abbreviated sermon and a time for worship. Our current schedule (8:30, 9:45 and 10:55) leaves no flexibility at the end of the first or second service for ministry time. For example, if a family wants to place their membership here and we want to welcome them and pray over them; or if a person is moved to make a profession of faith and we want to get better acquainted and pray with them; or if a person comes forward or desires prayer after a service... we don't really have time

without disrupting the next service, if I am to be involved.

Starting at 8:00, 9:30 and 11:00 gives us 30 minutes between each service. So much can happen in that extra time: ministry to spiritual needs (our #1 priority); time to welcome, orient, and befriend visitors (our #2 priority); and deepen ties of Christian love over coffee and snacks! Our Sunday School classes will continue to be at 9:30 (currently 2 adult classes) and 11:00 (classes for all ages). Let's continue to make Sunday mornings an opportunity for worship, evangelism, Bible Study and fellowship and test this new schedule to see if it doesn't open up more opportunities for all of these.

Remember, for Labor Day weekend we observe our usual schedule; the new start times begin on Sunday, Sept. 9<sup>th</sup>. Let's open up doors to the Kingdom of God!

### **Pumpkins Are Coming**

For the past ten years, Cumberland has partnered with the Pumpkin Patch Fundraising Company to sell pumpkins on the lawn of the church. This ministry is the main fundraising event of Cumberland's Board of Deacons and has seen increased rewards every year. The proceeds are divided evenly between the Deacons and the

Christian Education Ministry.

Pumpkin Patch is an integral part of our church's identity, as we are sometimes referred to as "the Pumpkin Patch Church." This project provides opportunities for us to fellowship as a church as well as to minister to many in the community. In addition, many volunteers from Lubbock schools and Texas Tech Univ. get involved in this ministry.

Funds received from pumpkin sales are used for benevolent ministries within our congregation, our community, nationally and internationally. Some examples of these ministries include the following: Food Box Ministry, DVD Ministry, Homeless Ministry (Tent City, Carpenter's Church, Blessing Bags), Boys & Girls Club, Texas Boys Ranch, Salvation Army, Meals on Wheels, Our United Outreach (OUO), and Missions.

The first load of pumpkins is scheduled to arrive here at Cumberland on Sept. 29! Opportunities for YOU to get involved will be made known soon. For those who are new to the patch, a training is scheduled to take place after the all-church potluck dinner on Sept. 23. Thank you for your generous dedication in making it all work!



#### Youth Sculpture



# TREASURER'S TALK By Richard Trussell

#### Generosity—Part 1, Giving To God

(These thoughts are courtesy of Ruben Swint from an article I read. Parts 2, 3, and 4 will appear in Oct., Nov., and Dec. Outlook's.)

Giving is not a solo act. Giving occurs in relationships. The primary relationship in our giving is our relationship to God. Giving is between God and us; and God participates in our giving decisions, or should. God knows who or what we truly worship for they are reflected in our spending and giving behaviors. God desires for us that we become caring and generous people, not simply religious participants. Read Micah 6:6-8. Giving to God can be pleasing to God, depending on how we live our lives. Giving to God is an opportunity to renew our focus on what matters to God.

God is pleased when people give themselves to God in their everyday living. Giving to God should be much more than a religious behavior. Giving to God can represent a statement of our daily trust in God for all our living.


