"TIRED CHURCHES"

Is your Church "tired"? Do Churches get "tired", just like an individual or even a family does? The answer is YES! How does this happen? The answer is a 4-letter word. It happens when a Church gets too "b.u.s.y."!

Years ago, Adrian Rogers made this statement: "If Satan cannot make you bad, he will make you busy." There is much wisdom in that statement, as cluttered lives are typically not Christ-centered lives.

Quoting from Eric Geiger who says, "The Lord encourages us to be still and know that He is God. (Psalm 46:10) Obviously, there is a connection between being still and knowing God. When we are continually busy, grinding out the work, our awareness, awe, and *knowledge* of Him decreases!"

■ Many Pastors have wisely encouraged their people to slow down and live by defined and chosen priorities, but many Churches don't follow this counsel. If a Church is "too busy", what are the major consequences? Again, Eric Geiger says there are three:

- 1) Families are pulled in many directions.
- 2) Church people only know Church people.
- 3) Pastors become program managers.

Dan Reiland suggests that Pastors/Staff and Church Leaders realize "<u>A Lean Ministry</u> is a <u>Smart Ministry</u>." He makes two keen observations:

- 1. When ministries are allowed to follow their own course, without change or pruning, they will become more complicated and less effective over time.
- 2. The more complex a Church becomes, the less the leaders believe simplicity can be achieved.

■ Dan served for years on Church Staff with Dr. John Maxwell in California. He's an "old-timer", but sometimes the "young bucks" ■ could learn from this man skilled in wisdom and leadership!

Dan shares these suggestions and thoughts:

- A Lean Ministry Model (LMM) will help your Church create the "margin" that allows you to get better at the ministries you do offer.
- A LMM helps to create the "margin" your people need to pursue God personally, and build healthier families.
- A LMM will allow you to create the "margin" necessary to respond to the Holy Spirit prompts. You create the "space" needed for Him to move!

To help you assess the causes of over-busy, less effective, and "tired" Churches, let me mention another author, Thom Ranier, from Lifeway. Here's what Thom says are the problems and causes that get us into this predicament:

- 1. Church Leaders fail to ask the "why" question.
 When a Church has no clear and compelling purpose for a ministry, it becomes just another activity.
- 2. Churches often have no process in place to eliminate ministries.

 Ministries continue even if they are no longer effective or needed. They become like the clutter in our homes.
- 3. Some ministries are started just to please people. Church leaders take the path of least resistance and add ministries just because a few members want them.
- 4. Ministries in many Churches operate in a silo.

The student ministry has its own plans. The music ministry makes extensive plans but never asks how they fit in with the rest of the Church. An Adult Small Group ministry has its own calendar, without regard for the Church as a whole.

So, how do you change to a "lean" approach, a focused Church ministry, a healthy and effective Church experience that results in spiritual ENERGY and lasting results? Let me give you some condensed thoughts from all my reading......

1. Step Back or Step Away periodically so you can become Spiritually Strategic!

(If you want to know how to do this, or receive some suggestions so that you can work out your own plan, ask! This Fall I talked with three Pastors including two outside our Association about just this subject. You know people you can talk to, so TALK!)

2. Establish clearly defined priorities that allow for "margins"!

Margins are "time spaces" that are not already planned full, so that the spontaneous can occur, or the important (rest, family), or the extra.

3. Communicate well with Leaders to get "buy-in".

God speaks through our Team to us and each other, and then through the Team to a congregation. Teams lead out together.

4. Practice a Church-wide Sabbath.

Would it hurt the Church to detox from ministry busyness occasionally? Do only the necessary, non-optional ministries like the Sunday morning schedule for a specified time period. Just let the Church rest from the "extracurricular". Sometimes Staff members seem to be trying to outdo other Staff members to prove the importance of their ministries over those of others, or just to receive praise and "strokes". We need to see the big picture!

5. Focus on Stories of Changed Lives.

These stories are relational. The Church that is too busy often loses
the relational aspect in Church life, and becomes more
institutional. The relational is empowerment to all we do!
