Review of the Insert:

"The Heart God Revives"

- > surprising silence (conviction / contrite)
- > a turning of the gaze from the binoculars to the mirror (healthy introspection)

- > an awareness of the others in the room
- > "Not thinking less of yourself; but thinking of yourself ... less" [C. S. Lewis]

> Such an awareness of Jesus Christ in your life, that it leads to an *aching dependence* upon Him and an *ardent desire* for more of Him.

> A prayer life that goes from *petitions only* to something like PSALM 51 (our text today)

It is a prayer life that almost sees petitions as an interruption of worship, even though it is a necessary part of a prayer life
