So the AAAHHHH column is back. I'm not sure how often it will be published. I'm trying to learn a lot of new things really fast (how to do pastoral care in a digital world, streaming worship, online giving, etc.) but the column is back. Feel free to share with others. For those who have neither, there's good old fashioned page printing, or take a picture and share it on your device.

To close I'd like to reiterate I told the Church on March 15: "God is our refuge and strength, a help always near in times of great trouble. That's why we won't be afraid when the world falls apart!" (Ps. 46:1-2 CEB). aaahhhh......
