The Bethlehem Candle

Micah 5:2-4

Leader:

The 2ND Advent candle is traditionally called the Bethlehem candle.

Bethlehem reminds us that God comes to us in the humble and simple.

Bethlehem was in the territory of one of the least influential tribes of Judah, yet out of Bethlehem comes the King of Kings.

Bethlehem reminds us that Jesus was born in a small town; that He was born in a stable; that He was born to people of no fame.

Bethlehem is God's statement that God does great and wonderful things from humble beginnings.

Let's read responsively.

Congregation:

But you, O Bethlehem of Ephrathah, who are too little to be among the clans of Judah,

from you shall come forth for me one who is to rule in Israel, whose coming forth is from of old, from ancient days.

Leader:

Therefore he shall give them up until the time when she who is in labor has given birth; then the rest of his brothers shall return to the people of Israel.

Congregation:
