### Pastor's Christmas Message

"Advent" is a term we Christians use at this time of year, but what does it mean? The term is derived from the Latin word meaning "coming". The church observes Advent beginning on the fourth Sunday before Christmas and ending on Christmas. It is a time of expectant waiting and preparation for the celebration of the <u>birth of Jesus</u> at <u>Christmas</u>, as well as the return of Jesus at the second coming. This year our Advent worship will be based on the book "Faithful—Christmas Through the Eyes of Joseph" by Adam Hamilton. Usually, we think of Mary at this time of the year, because there is more information about her in the Christmas story in the Bible. But I believe that there is much that we can learn from the story and experience of Joseph.

I invite you to join us for this series of messages, either in person or via online streaming. Our first Advent service is on November 28 at our usual 10:00 AM worship time and continues for the next 3 Sundays (12/5, 12/12 and 12/19). We will wrap it up with a candlelight Christmas Eve service to be held on 12/24 at 7:00 PM. We will observe the Covid protocols and recommendations in order to protect everyone.

Are you looking for something different this Christmas season? All are invited to join us for this special time. Come as you are and prepare to be moved by the story of Joseph. He was a person just like us ... fearful and imperfect, but chosen by God to play a pivotal role in God's plan to save mankind.

2021 Theme Knitted Together for God's Good Work

PROGRAM
The Gift of Mentoring

Objective: To explore the story of Mary and Elizabeth as encouragement for women to mentor one another as spiritual leaders, acting for justice and trans-formation of the world.

Scripture: Luke 1: 26-56

Opening Prayer
Come, thou long-expected Jesus, be with us in this hour as we step away from the busyness of the world to pray, study and plan to take action for justice and peace.
Bless us with your vision of righteousness and shalom for all people and all creation.
Amen.

#### God-Bearer

Mary has received a perplexing revelation from the angel Gabriel. Gabriel tells her to not be afraid (surely a revelation from an angel must have been so strange that she was afraid) and further that she will bear a child. Her immediate reaction is to ask how, because she is in a legal betrothal—a contract in which she is bound to Joseph legally while she still lives under the protection of her father's house, waiting

until the formality of marriage if finalized.

Gabriel tells Mary—her mind still questioning how this pronouncement could possibly be true—that her relative Elizabeth is also pregnant. How Mary is related to Elizabeth is not made clear in the scripture, but Mary knows that Elizabeth is older and had never had children. Once Mary knows about Elizabeth's baby, another miracle, she decides to say yes to God, to say yes to be the bearer of God into the world. The Eastern Orthodox Church calls Mary Theotokos, or "God-bearer," because she is the first to say yes to Jesus, to say yes to God's plan for the world through Jesus.

#### **Shared Joy**

Mary could have stayed in her parents' home, yet she goes "with haste" on a journey to visit Elizabeth. Together these women share their joy of expectation. When Mary is with Elizabeth, she is empowered to sing her song of praise. Mary stays with Elizabeth for three months, which means that she was with Elizabeth until just before the birth of John the Baptist. As Mary's pregnancy begins, Elizabeth's comes to fruition. We could assume that Mary's older female relative shares with her the wisdom and knowledge of preparing for the birth of a child, for caring for her own body.

Elizabeth functions as a prophet, announcing as soon as she sees Mary that her child shall be the Lord, which is Luke's title for Jesus. Elizabeth makes this pronouncement before Mary tells her that she is pregnant. Through the Spirit, Elizabeth has wisdom to share with Mary. Being pregnant in itself is not an easy thing, but an unanticipated pregnancy that draws attention from everyone around can be very stressful. We can imagine that Elizabeth's mentoring of Mary through the first trimester would have helped Mary to handle the pressure and stress that she was to face.

The Gift of a Mentor
Priscilla and Jack Levison, authors of
How Is It With Your Soul? describe three
characteristics of mentoring:
a mentor is intentional, going out of
their way to guide, teach and lead others;
a mentor offers hospitality, welcoming
people into their home and offering food and
drink;

a mentor is a relationship for friendship, not a project with a deadline.

When Mary arrives unexpectedly on Elizabeth's doorstep, Elizabeth does not hesitate to take her in and offer hospitality. These two women share a special bond in their relationship that makes space for Elizabeth to mentor Mary. She does not focus just on her own needs, her own pregnancy at an advanced age, but makes time for Mary. We could assume that Mary's older female relative shares with her the wisdom and knowledge of preparing for that birth of a child, for caring for her own body.

These two points are essential in the Christmas story: Mary said yes. Mary was the first person to say yes to God's work through Jesus. We could imagine how Elizabeth's own miracle and acceptance of Mary gave her the courage to sing out boldly about God's transforming work in the world.

Thoughts to ponder
The term Theotokos was used in the early years of the church, naming Mary as "God-bearer." How do the images of Mary your have seen depict her?
Who are the women who have mentored you in United Methodist Women?
In your life outside the church?
Who is outside the circle and can be mentored?

Make an Action Plan
In knitting, the yarn is carefully
stitched together in patterns that match their
strength to the purpose. An open-stitch
potholder made with decorative or delicate
yarns wouldn't be very useful for its purpose.

Socks need to be knit in a pattern that is comfortable and keeps your toes covered inside a shoe or boot. Just as patterns are stitched together for a purpose, women are knit together in the body of Christ for a purpose. We mentor and encourage each other so that we will be equipped to sing God's song of praise and work for justice.

United Methodist Women has a long history of mentoring young women into leadership roles. This is part of the critical work of "building toward the future," in the words of Harriett Jane Olson, chief executive officer of United Methodist Women. Olson encourages us to be mentors so that our sisters in Christ for them to develop their gifts of leadership.

Many United Methodist churches are small membership churches and struggle to have a strong United Methodist Women's group. These groups may need a larger United Methodist Women group to mentor them, provide transportation to district or conference spiritual growth events, or assist them with registration for Mission u or Assembly.

Closing Prayer
Come, Holy One, into our world and into our lives again.

Come, Lord Jesus, when we least expect it, renew your call for us to say yes and follow you.

Come, Lord Jesus, into our world and into our lives again. Into the lives of the poor, bring hope; into the lives of the powerful, bring humility; into the lives of the weary, bring rest; into the lives of the busy, bring wisdom and peace.

Come, Lord Jesus, into our world and into our lives again. We say yes again, O Lord, and give ourselves to you. Bind us together in your service and mission to this world that you love. May others see your love and grace through our action in your name. Amen.


#### TRANSPORTATION
