To my beloved Friends and Members;

I come to you with many thoughts clouding my mind. Thoughts like, "What will happen at the General Conference? What decisions will be made? How will it affect those calling themselves United Methodist? How will it affect the people of my churches? And who will be harmed?"

I am a lifelong United Methodist like many of you. I grew up in the United Methodist Church in Odessa, New York. I became an active member and Pastor knowing and loving what they stood for. It hurts me believing that the denomination that I know, and love will almost certainly split. Certainly, challenges will continue to come our way. But friends let me ask that we not worry about these situations, for we have a much greater job to do, and that is the work as disciples of Jesus Christ. We are given marching orders in scripture; make disciples, spread the Word, care for the sick, house the homeless, feed the hungry and clothe the naked. We are taught in scripture to LOVE, which we must do with a greater effort than ever in this world that seems so lost. I ask you simply to be "The Church" that Christ wants us to be in our communities, in our country and in our world. Together we will make a difference with Christ by our side.

One of the fundamentals of Souper Bowl of Caring is 100% of everything collected by our participants is donated directly to the charity of their choice. Because of this, we rely on donations from caring people like you to help us continue our mission. Every donation helps Souper Bowl of Caring empower youth, unite communities and generate food and resources at a critical time of year when charities are reporting a decrease in volunteers and donations. A donation to Souper Bowl of Caring is an investment: For every \$1 you donate, \$19 is generated for charities in local communities across the country.

## MEMBERSHIP CARE PROJECT

The Membership Care Committee of Grace United Methodist has been committed to carrying out local missions, always with the generous support of the congregation.
