

Good Morning All:

As you can see from the date of this newsletter, someone was late in turning in his article. I apologize for keeping you waiting. September has been a crazy, but wonderful month at Grace. Starting out at the beginning of the month I was again asked to give the invocation for the Corning City Council meeting, I continued to work with Corning Hospital in developing their Chaplaincy Program and we had our first Heroes Celebration on the 10th.

But then we got busy. On the 12th of September we met as a Board of Trustees and it was determined that before winter comes, we would make the roof repair a priority, therefore we contacted Apgar Construction for a quote. Board member Gail McIntyre had talked with them and they advised her that they do slate roof repair. Apgar is a local roofing company from Breesport. Terry Oakden made arrangements for them to meet us at the church. They sent out their representative and our BOT members Denny O'Connell and Rusty Dye accompanied him to the roof top. They found significant damage, with holes big enough to put your whole hand in. After coming off the roof I viewed pictures that he had taken and it was even more evident that the repair simply could not wait and I directed him to get us a quote as soon as possible. Within a few days they returned a quote and it was forwarded to all Trustees. The Trustees formed a consensus that we should move forward. We officially held a meeting on September 29th after church where the Board of Trustees proposed that we have the project completed at a cost of \$23,800. It was approved by all Council members present.

The cost includes repair of the slate roof on the South side of the roof, shingling and repair of the shingled roof and reroofing the flat rubber coated roof. This project carries a 25-year warranty and will take care of the roof for a very long time. So how do we pay for it? We will use the \$6077 that has been set aside for roof repair along with the \$8381 that we currently hold for capital funds for a total of \$14,458, that leaves a balance of \$9342. The remaining total can be taken from our Ameritrade investment account if necessary. We would like to keep those investments in place but realize that the project must move forward to prevent further damage. If anybody would like to contribute toward this project, please see me.

We continue to do amazing things in this community. We have transported around sixty seniors to Wegmans from Knoxville apartments, we participated in the Farmers Market for the last several weeks to earn money for the Back Pack Program, many thanks to those that have made that happen, and we also participated in the Gaffer District's Harvest Festival, receiving over \$500 for the Back Pack program, while I had an opportunity to read to children and made a soup for the annual soup off, placing third, come by my office to see our plaque. We were given a check for \$500 from the Gaffer District for our assistance in the Field of Flags program. But trust me, we are not through! There are many things on the horizon, get involved - it is your church!


