
I found this recently online and wanted to include it in this edition of our newsletter. I think it is what we need and the world needs:

GOING GREEN

Did you know that Going Green is a social justice issue? "All creation is the Lord's, and we are responsible for the ways in which we use and abuse it. Water, air, soil, minerals, energy resources, plants, animal life, and space are to be valued and conserved because they are God's creation and not solely because they are useful to human beings. God has granted us stewardship of creation. We should meet these stewardship duties through acts of loving care and respect." (Social Principles, ¶ 160)

This is the perfect time to begin planning how to live out our stewardship to God's creation by "going green". In our homes and in our local churches and organizations we can take actions that have a far-reaching impact not only on the environment but our health as well. These simple actions will bring increased health and wellness of our homes, our bodies and God's beautiful creation.

- 1. In your home- Begin to reduce your use of pre-packaged processed foods changing to eat more whole food. Summer is a great time for stocking up on fresh veggies. Consider canning or freezing for winter consumption. Switch to non-toxic cleaning such as fragrance-free dye free laundry soaps and personal products. Use white vinegar and baking soda for great allpurpose scrubbing cleaner for your kitchen. A hydrogen peroxide-based cleaner is a great disinfectant. Research the use of organic pesticides in your gardens. A great alternative is a teaspoon of castile soap in a quart spray bottle. There are lots of ideas online.
- 2. At your workplace Use your own takealong coffee mug instead of Styrofoam or paper products. When making copies utilize both sides of the paper.
- 3. When we are back to hosting events The United Methodist Women have a wonderful Guide for Sustainable meetings that covers many aspects we usually don't think about . Download and save this for when we are allowed to gather together again. https://www.unitedmethodistwomen.org/sust ainability/guidelines
