From the President

I have a wood working web friend who lives in the Ukraine. I have known him for several years. He recently posted on our forum the following message. This year Lakeside will be donating our Lenten offering to the ELCA Eastern Europe Relief fund which will help the residents of the Ukraine and the many refugees. If you wish to help, mark your donation as Lent or Lenten or Ukraine. Together we can make a difference. "Hi everyone, firstly, I want to say that I am safe in my town Kherson (Ukraine), at the moment the town is occupied by Russians. There are many Russian military in the city (patrols, checkpoints). We try not to leave the house if it is not necessary. There is already a shortage of medicines in the city, there are practically no products in the stores, because there are no supplies - the Russians do not let anyone into the Kherson region, even humanitarian aid. There are many farms in the Kherson region and after the Russians allowed entry into the town from neighboring villages (with a full search of cars and checking documents), many farmers brought meat and vegetables to the city, but the prices are very high and there are long queues. Peaceful rallies are held in the town center almost every day. At first, the Russians ignored it, a few days ago they started shooting into the air to disperse the rally, and yesterday they used smoke and tear grenades, people were injured from fragments of grenades. Here's what's happening in Kherson."

Worship Matters By Diane Colin

April 3rd: April launches us into our continued march toward Easter beginning with the fifth Sunday in Lent. The parament color is purple. Our readings for the day include Psalm 126:5 which says, "Those who sowed in tears will reap with songs of joy." From Phil. 3:4b, "To know Christ and his resurrection is to share in his sufferings." We also read that Mary anticipates Jesus' suffering and anoints his feet with costly perfume in preparation for his burial. We hear Paul recall his transformation from the persecutor Saul into an apostle. Music for the day includes *More Precious Than Silver; Jesus, Remember Me; Beneath the Cross of Jesus and Take My Life That I May Be (Caribbean Version).*


April 10th: PALM SUNDAY: We begin this day in the narthex with palm branches, re-enacting Jesus' triumphant march into Jerusalem. This event was mentioned in all four of the Gospels in the New Testament. According to the Gospels, Jesus rode on a donkey into Jerusalem, and the celebrating people there laid down their cloaks and small branches of trees in front of him, singing part of Psalm 118: 25–26° "Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord. We bless you from the house of the Lord." The symbolism of the donkey may refer to the Eastern tradition that it is an animal of peace, unlike the horse which is the animal of war. A king would have ridden a horse when he was bent on war and ridden a donkey to symbolize his arrival in peace. Jesus' entry to Jerusalem would have symbolized his entry as the Prince of Peace, not as a war-waging king. In places where palm branches are difficult to grow or get, people have used olive branches and those of a willow or yew tree. Some denominations call this Passion Sunday, Yew Sunday and also Hosanna Sunday. Christians take these blessed palms to their homes where they hang them alongside Christian art (especially crosses and crucifixes) or keep them in their Bibles or devotionals. In the period preceding the next year's Lent, remaining palms are burned on Shrove Tuesday to make the ashes to be used on the following day, Ash Wednesday, which is the first day of Lent. Music includes *All Glory, Laud and Honor; Jesus, Remember Me.* This service will move in tone from joyful to somber as we are led into Holy Week.

Maundy Thursday: (7PM) This evening our Lenten observance comes to an end, and we gather with Christians around the world to celebrate the Three Days of Jesus' death and resurrection. Tonight we remember Christ's last meal with his disciples, but the central focus is his commandment that we live out the promise embodied in this meal. As Jesus washed his disciples' feet, so we are called to give and receive love in humble service to one another. Formed into a new body in Christ through this holy meal, we are transformed by the mercy we have received and carry it into the world. The altar is stripped. Departing worship in solemn silence, we anticipate the coming days. Music includes Jesu, Jesu Fill Us With Your Love and Loaves Were Broken, Words Were Spoken.

Good Friday: (3PM) We stand with the disciples at the foot of the cross, we pray for the whole world in the ancient bidding prayer, as Christ's death offers life to all. We gather in solemn devotion, but always with the promise that the tree around which we assemble is indeed a tree of life. Our service of readings takes us through the most cruel, unjust day in history. We depart silently, and we anticipate the culmination of the Three Days in the Easter Vigil. Music is instrumental with only "Were You There" sung. The cross is draped in black.

April 17th: Easter Sunday (8AM & 10:30AM) We gather with Mary Magdalene, Mary the mother of James, and Salome, we may feel astonished and confused, unsure of what to make of the empty tomb. But this is why we gather: to proclaim, witness, praise, and affirm the liberating reality of Christ's death and resurrection. In word and feast, we celebrate God's unending love, and depart to share this good news with all the world. Alleluia! Special music with traditional hymns will add to the joy of this day. The parament color is white. Alleluias return: *Alleluia*, *He is risen indeed*, *Alleluia*!

April 24th: The second Sunday of Easter. (There are seven Sundays of the season of Easter, ending on Sunday, June 5th which is Pentecost Sunday.) A RESURRECTION? It is hard to believe! Because it is hard to believe, John the evangelist will provide sign after sign celebrating Jesus' victory over death. Because it is hard to believe, the risen Jesus will return to us again and again in the mystery of Holy Communion, inviting us to touch and taste his presence, and offering us his peace. Music for the day includes *Christ is Risen, Alleluia and Breathe on us Breath of God.*


