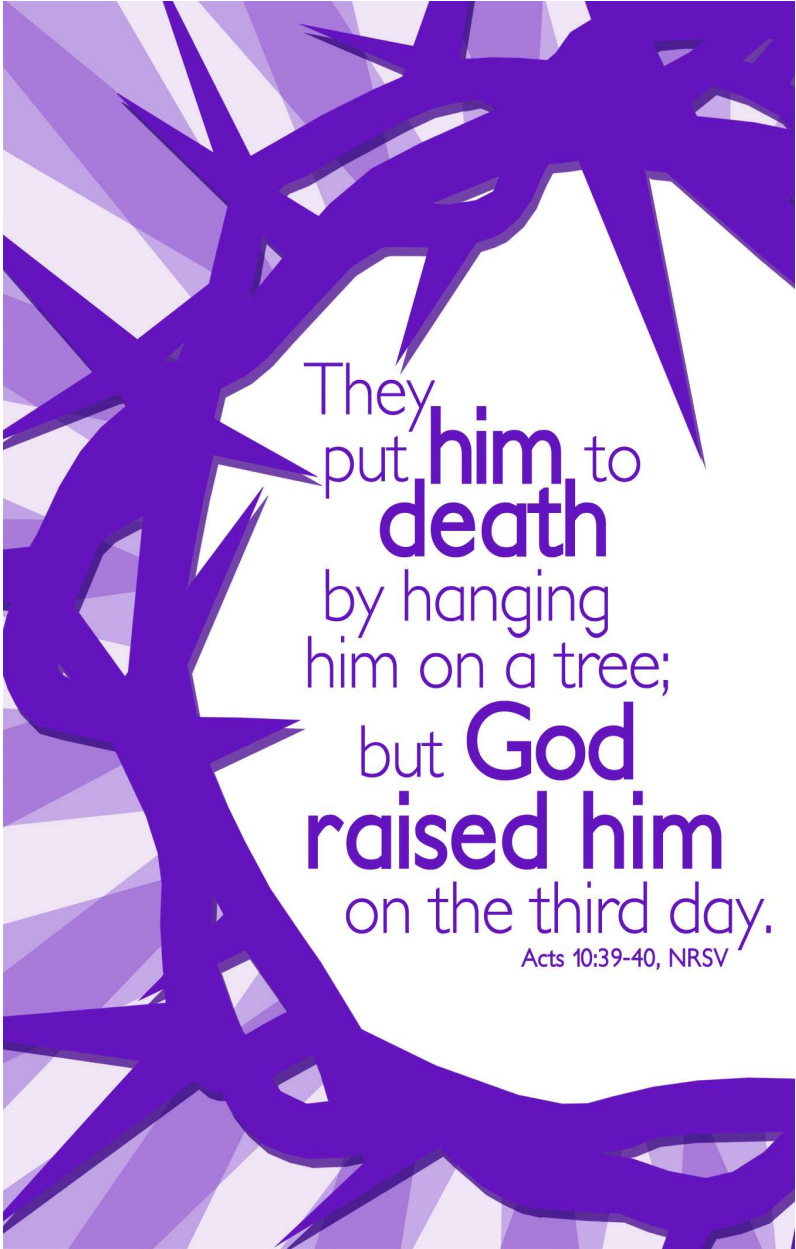

Dear Church Family,

The late Dr. Jerry Falwell made one of the most astounding statements that I have ever heard. He said this, “Old maps will not guide the Church into a new world.” Now some of you will totally miss the significance of that statement. Jesus said the same thing when He said in Luke 5:37-38 (NKJV), “And no one puts new wine into old wineskins; or else the new wine will burst the wineskins and be spilled, and the wineskins will be ruined. But new wine must be put into new wineskins, and both are preserved.”

“Wineskins” were goatskins made into watertight bags. New wine expands as it ages; the wineskins had to be new and pliable wineskins. Used skins had become hard and dry. When filled with new wine that expands these old skins would burst and spill the wine. The Pharisees were like that; they were hard and dry and could not accept Jesus. They could not accept that their traditions or rules weren’t going to work. Christianity required new approaches, new traditions, and new structures.

Likewise, our church programs, ministries, and the way we do things should not be so structured that they have no room for a fresh touch of the Spirit, a new method, or a new idea. You and I must be careful not to allow our hearts to become so dry, hard, and calloused that they prevent us from accepting something new that Christ wants to bring.

The message of the Gospel will always remain “new” because it must be accepted and applied in every generation. As you and I follow Christ, we must be prepared for new ways to live, new ways to look at people, new ways to serve.

Too many times our worship and our Christian life becomes nothing more than religious rituals and ruts, which is another way of saying its dead. That’s why a lot of worship services sound like funeral dirges. The Christian life is a feast, not a famine or a funeral.
