Dear School Partner,

Did you know that 39% of our COVID-related hospitalizations have occurred in November? Put it another way — we've been in the pandemic for eight months, and nearly 40% of our cases requiring hospitalization have happened in less than the last three weeks. It's no wonder our hospitals are warning of capacity concerns and new restrictions are being implemented statewide.

A quick look at our numbers: 348 new cases *just today*, bringing our total for the week to 1,506, and our total to date to 6,544. We've had 8 deaths in the last week. And we currently have 104 people hospitalized (50 more than last week at this time). ICU cases have also nearly doubled – 28 as of today, compared to 15 last Thursday.

Some resources/information you may find useful:

- You've no doubt heard that Governor Walz issued a new Executive Order that goes into effect tomorrow (Friday) at 11:59 p.m. If you're looking for details on what all it includes, and the rationale behind it, here's some good information.
- Updates on testing opportunities:
  - The new testing site opened yesterday at the Hibbing Armory. They offer the less invasive nasal swab test (last week we mistakenly said it was a saliva test. My apologies!) Just over 350 people came to be tested on the first day. I've attached a flier with all of the dates, but the schedule changes week to week, so it might be more helpful to refer people directly to the registration site to find a date/time that works for them
  - The Saliva Testing Site at the DECC is now open 7 days/week.
  - And a reminder that the <u>Saliva Test at Home</u> is now available state wide.
- Lastly, we are excited to introduce you to the COVID Ref! He is the star of our new public service announcement campaign and uses a lot of football metaphors to teach people (using humor and a fun approach) about proper way to wear a mask, quarantine, and safe gatherings.
