What a powerful testimony to the effectiveness of the media and the educational system and the ineffectiveness of the church. In the media, it is hard to find a movie or sitcom where any attraction between a man and a women means that they not go to bed together. At the same time, the church is losing its effectiveness by becoming bedfellows with the world. The church is so concerned with loving others, not offending people, being tolerant, being "seeker sensitive, being relevant, etc., that it no longer teaches and preaches the message of God. God says, "Do not commit adultery" (Deuteronomy 5:18). He also says, "Marriage should be honored by all, and the marriage bed kept pure, for God will judge the adulterer and the sexually immoral" (Hebrews 13:4). Can God be clearer than that? The implications are clear. To keep the marriage bed pure mandates that there is no defilement by pre-marital or extra-marital sex.

Finally, God says he will judge those who violate His word. Maybe this is why the above article reports that "the shift is affecting children's lives. . . [for they] face elevated risks of poverty, failing in school or suffering from emotional and behavioral problems . . .

Maybe it is time the church, and all Christians, to repent and take God's word seriously. For these statistics could only happen if "Christians" are participating in this worldly behavior.
