All we can do is prepare for it as best we can. The weather will do whatever it wants to.

It is even more humbling to realize that the weather has no will of its own but is under the authority of another, a higher authority. God said, "As long as the earth endures, seedtime and harvest, cold and heat, summer and winter, day and night, will never cease" (Genesis 8:22). Furthermore the Lord Jesus said, "[God] causes his sun to rise on the evil and the good, and sends rain on the righteous and the unrighteous" (Matt 5:45). You see, whether we like the weather or not, we are not in charge of it. And, whether we like it or not, we are not the final authority over our lives either, God is. And whether we like it or not, we will have to give an answer to him for the way we have lived our lives.
