Camp Info For Parent/Guardian

Registration and Check-In

Registration for campers will be in the Multi-Purpose Building on the first day of camp from 1:00-2:00 p.m. Upon check-in campers will turn in medication and be checked for head lice.

If your child needs to leave for any reason during camp, he or she must be signed out at the nurse's office by a parent or guardian. They must see nurse and be re-checked in prior to returning to camp.

Items to Pack

Try to pack light. There is very little space for each camper. A small suitcase that can slide under the bed works best.

-Bedding (twin bed): fitted sheet, blanket/sleeping bag, pillow

-Personal care items: Shower bag with soap, washcloth, 3 towels (shower, pool, spare), toothbrush, toothpaste, comb or brush, deodorant, shampoo, sunscreen, and bug repellent. If you think your daughter's monthly is close, please send feminine products and remind her she may go to her cabin leader if needed.

-Clothing for five days: shorts (fingertip length or longer), t-shirts (no inappropriate logos or phrases), sweatshirt for air-conditioned buildings, undergarments and socks, pajamas (modest/shorts and t-shirt), swimsuit (no two-piece or revealing swimsuits), athletic shoes or sports sandal with backstrap (for safety reasons), flipflops for pool and shower. If possible, label all clothing.

-laundry bag or something for dirty clothes

-Bible, notebook, pens

-Food items are discouraged. However, any snacks brought must be in sealed containers

-DO NOT BRING: suntan oil, radios, hand-held games, ipods, jewelry, fireworks, drugs, alcohol, pornography, or weapons

If you need to contact your camper, please call the office at 573-774-2926. We will bring your camper to the office and have them call. Any items that have been left at the camp will be held for 30 days. Please contact the office to make arrangements to pick them up. They will be given to a charity organization after 30 days.

Rules For Campers

- 1. All medication must be given to the nurse upon arriving at camp. This includes all prescription medications and all over-the-counter medications (examples: aspirin, tylenol). Please bring a current photo to place with the medication.
- 2. Campers must attend all camp activities.
- 3. Camp grounds must be respected. No destructive use of camp property. If you have trash, find a trash can.
- 4. No profane language or bullying will be tolerated.
- 5. Campers needing to leave the group for any reason must have leader's permission and at least one other camper with them.
- 6. No public displays of affection.
- 7. You must be in your cabin from lights out through morning rise and shine. (No late night cabin raids or cabin switching)
- 8. Only one camper sleeping per bed.
- 9. Campers may not use radios, ipods, cell phones, etc.
- 10. Campers must always wear shoes outside of cabin.
- 11. Dress code will be enforced at all times. Cabin leaders will make final decisions on all clothing.
- 12. Posted pool rules will be strictly enforced.
- 13. No hiking allowed on the trail without the counselors.
