Among evangelical Protestants, nearly 2 in 5 (37-39%) say the pandemic has strengthened their faith.

By the second Easter of the pandemic, church attendance for Easter had risen but wasn't back to typical levels; around 2 in 5 Christians (37-39%) said they planned to go in person this year, compared to the 62% who normally do.

#### Jesus – Compassionate Friend # 7

### He's a Friend Who Guides Us Luke 9:1-6, 10-11

This passage marks a significant transition for our Lord Jesus.		
Approximately of His three-year ministry is over, and His death on the cross is about months away.		
Up until now, the Twelve observed, listened, questioned, and learned, but Jesus instructed. The time had come for His trainees to put their learning into practice.		
The instructions Jesus gave His disciples before sending them out were to them – their time, their mission, their circumstances, their particular needs in the training process.		
Still, there are some helpful guidelines for us today		
1. Keep the main thing		
" He sent them out to proclaim the kingdom of God"		
Our preeminent charge is to teach the in love (Eph. 4:15).		
2. Prepare well, but travel (v. 3)		

He told them: "Take nothing for the journey—no staff, no bag, no bread, no money, no extra shirt.

Maintaining balance - can sometimes be difficult . . . We tend to think of good preparation as packing *more* stuff for the iournev . . . Jesus wasn't saying, "Don't plan; just go; wing it." In fact, when announcing His departure from the earth. He gave them different instructions (23:35-36). Jesus was encouraging them (and us) to stay on the mission – to be careful that we don't get so caught up in planning for every contingency that we forget about the mission itself. By "traveling light," we spend less time thinking about how we meet the objectives and focus more on actually getting them accomplished. 3. Lighten up and get \_\_\_\_\_. (v. 5) If people do not welcome you, leave their town and shake the dust off your feet . . . Not everyone \_\_\_\_\_ the truth. Not everyone will like what you have to say. We need to learn to to objections and take in constructive criticism, but don't fear what people think. Don't spend more time thinking about what your critics think than on what God thinks. Ask God for thicker skin and learn to laugh at yourself; it'll help!

# 4. Invite the \_\_\_\_\_ of people you trust and respect. (v. 10)

When the apostles returned, they reported to Jesus what they had done. Then He took them with Him and they withdrew by themselves to Bethsaida . . .

When the Twelve returned, they debriefed the mission with Jesus. In fact, He took them on a disciples' retreat in order to rest and reflect.

Getting people you trust and respect to offer helpful critique and constructive praise will help you plan better and worry less. In addition, the carping criticism of others will carry less weight.
