Dear Beloved Churches,

In the book of Acts, chapter 16, Paul experienced the joys and challenges of mission work. As he travelled throughout Asia Minor, he came to the city of Lystra where he would meet his lifetime friend and son in the faith, Timothy, who would join him in his mission endeavors. With such a dynamic duo, God blessed these two immensely, and the Scriptures tell us that "[T]he churches were strengthened in the faith and increased in number daily." 
