Dear *Centennial Baptist,*

I just want to take this moment to thank you for your thoughts, prayers, and financial contributions that led me to the Dominican Republic on a medical mission. Without your contributions, I would have been unable to participate in this expedition and would have missed out on some most unique experiences.


Our initial mission, once we arrived, was to conduct full physical examinations on the Dominican baseball players contracted to the Kansas City Royals Baseball Academy. Out of the 60 players we examined, only two were set aside for additional testing before they would be able to participate in spring try-outs.

The remaining two days, myself and the other 5 medical students who accompanied me, ran Clinic in two communities, Guerra, a small town inside the province of Santa Domingo, and Pequeño Haiti (Little Haiti in Spanish) on the outskirts of Guerra. In those two days, we saw a total of 600 patients; needless to say, there was little time to breath during that two-day span. We treated everything from the flu, to malnutrition, and even acute heart failure.

I think my most memorable experience would have to revolve around the pregnant mothers. Our school recently acquired some hand-held ultrasound machines and since the Dean of our school accompanied us to the Dominican, we were able to bring two of the machines with us. The look on these mother's faces to see their unborn children for the first-time (ultrasound is a luxury only at the disposal of the very wealthy), it was truly unforgettable. The first child I helped image was sucking his thumb!

Another reason we were there was to pursue an interest of our school, to create a partnership with the government to establish a permanent presence by our school in the Dominican Republic. We met with the Governor of the province of Santa Domingo and we were able to tour the major trauma hospital of the country. It was surprising some of the technology they had present, hyperbaric chambers particularly, but even more surprising was the rudimentary standards of their surgical care. This was most evident in their orthopedic care of fractures and wounds, the field I desire to enter upon the completion of medical school in two short years. Cases that would be a simple fix in the States thanks to the advanced orthopedic care, is an difficult path to recovery in the Dominican.

Again, thank you so much for enabling me on this expedition to the Dominican and toward better understanding God's vision for my future in medicine.
