



Planet Aid has placed a bin for used clothing and shoes on our church premises.


Today's consumer know that a donation to Planet Aid will not only have environmental benefits but will be used to help those less fortunate than themselves.



Meatless Sweet Potato Chili - Really Good

3 medium Sweet potato peeled, and cut into 3/4 inch cubes

1 can black beans, rinsed and drained

1/2 medium onion -diced

I jar medium Salsa

4 cups vegetable broth

Salt and Pepper

1/8 t. -1/4 t. of Cumin, Oregano and Chili

Powder

Saute onions until transparent or lightly browned, add cubed sweet potatoes, broth and Salsa. Cook until potatoes are almost done, add beans, and spices.

Simmer 10 minutes more until it thickens and darken.

Add more spices if desired, being careful as this is already a little spicy hot. They have drizzled squeeze cheese on top of the chili in the pictures. I desired not to do that.

Serve with cornbread.... or Italian Bread




Recently the 8th Graders of Lakeview School system visited TCTC for Experience Day. TCTC is the Trumbull Career and Technical Center in Champion Ohio.

Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego story of Faithfulness [Daniel 3:1-30] (A Test of Faith)



Do you remember the story of the three Hebrew boys, Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego? A couple of Jewish captives were taken from their homeland to serve in the Babylonian empire.

But even having to adjust to the ways of this empire, their commitment to God did not change. Still, and just like any faithful men of God, their faith was put to the test.

King Nebuchadnezzar commanded that a golden statue be made and ordered that every person must bow down and worship it. However, when it was time for the three men to bow

down like the rest, they refused, and this angered the King.

Because of their refusal, they were thrown in a fiery furnace which was turned up seven times the normal temperature. The fire was so hot that it scorched the guards that were standing outside, but when the King looked inside expecting to see nothing but fire, he saw not three but four men.

Filled with shock, he immediately ordered for the men to be removed from the fire. Because of the three men's faith in God, he showed up while they were going through their fire. The King made a new declaration that they were now going to worship the God of Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego. Like Elijah the three stood bodly for Christ, and it was through their faith that other persons begun worshiping the true and living God.

Life application: Would you stand for God if you were faced with a situation where it was either life or death? We are now living in a time where our faithfulness is tested, and it's going to come a time where you have to decide who you will stand for. Life or death.

And the pressures of life sometimes will be turned up like it did for those three men, but once you stand for God, he will show up for you amid your fiery trials. The Bible says when you pass through the waters, he will be with you, or when you walk through the fire you will not be burned, for he is the Lord your God. (Isaiah 43:2-3)


