





Paul wanted the fellowship of working with other Christians when he went from Damascus back to Jerusalem (Acts 9:26).




This is the following from one family who identified with us long ago and thought it good to pass it along to you.

Godly Fear

Regularly many Christians downplay God's righteous judgement. Perhaps they're responding to times past when God's wrath was overemphasized, but we can also under-emphasize it.

These three aspects of God's character should instill godly fear in us:

1. His Holiness

God is not flawed in any way. He doesn't make mistakes. Every thing He does is pure, good and right (Jeremiah 9:23-24).

He hates sin (Psalm 7:11; Romans 1:18-19)

He will punish the unrepentant (Romans 2:5-11)

2. His Authority

No one tells God what to do. Nothing is beyond His jurisdiction.

He alone has the power of life and death (Deuteronomy 32:39)

He alone has the ability to save and destroy (John14:6,Acts4:12; Luke 12:4-5)

3. His Wisdom

God is all-knowing and all-wise (<u>Isaiah 40:12-31</u>).

He defines right from wrong (<u>Isaiah 33:22</u>; <u>2 Corinthians 5:10</u>)

He always knows what's best for us (Psalm 139).

Each of us must walk by the rule of faith that comes by hearing the word of God according to (Rom. 10:17). We understand (James 4:4) to teach that friendship with the world causes us to be the enemy of God.

When it comes to preaching the word, preachers must realize they too must also live by the word. To proclaim something that would just tickle ears and not be in harmony with "the God-breathed word" causes one, even if he were an angel from heaven, to be accursed.

We must not confer with men as to the preaching of the word. It has been certified already. Our job is to persuade men to obey it.



Cooper wanted to encourage her friend to grow older in a playful manner. She gave her friend a red hat of her own, suggesting that she keep it as a reminder to grow older playfully and on her own terms.

An Adventure-Trying Something New

Since graduating from college with her Bachelor's degree in Elementary Education in 2000, and graduate school in 2003 with her Master's degree in Education, <u>Heather</u>

<u>Sensabaugh</u>, from our congregation, has thought of creating a sort of "third place" for children - a place, that's not home or school, where they can play board games with peers, improve social skills, have fun, and learn about the world around them.

She taught 2nd grade for three years in upstate New York, met her husband and they decided to move to his home state of Ohio. She hoped it would be easy with her education and experience to find a job teaching in Ohio, "not so much" she said. Administrators and Superintendents told her that she was "too expensive" to hire, "overqualified" to teach. So she did substitute teaching, was a preschool teacher, a nanny and a tutor. Not lucrative enough to make sense doing with two young children to arrange daycare for.

Having no family near-by, it seemed challenging at times raising children without family support and wished there was a place that she could take them for a couple of hours, so she could shop, go to a movie, Dr. appointments and more. Her husbands job, Band Director at Lakeview High School, keeps him very busy. He is the director of all the bands, grade 8-12 and teaches a college level class through YSU-Lakeview partnership.

In 2012, she pitched this idea to a friend, a teacher with children, and her husband, then applied for financing. It took 3 years to close their loans, and many hurdles to overcome, to get to this point. But the time has come...
