Joy

We are quickly approaching a very special time of the year. It is a time were joy is abounding, but for what reasons does this joy abound. Is it for the excitement of the hustle and bustle that Thanksgiving and Christmas bring? Is it the happy decorations that we see scattered about? And then, once the holiday season is over where does this joy go? For as soon as the new year begins it seems that a heavy weight descends upon us. The weight of bearing the harshest months of the winter, and the cabin fever that begins to boil up inside of us. Perhaps this is because we received our joy from the wrong source.

The source of joy ought not be from a mere holiday or decorations, while those things can be enjoyed. The ultimate source of joy ought to be the Lord Himself. For "Splender and majesty are before Him; strength and joy are in His place" (1Chr. 16:27, HCSB). God is the giver of joy, not a red and green decoration. "On that day they offered great sacrifices and rejoiced **because God had given them great joy...**" (Neh. 12:43a, emphasis added). Are we living as though God is our greatest joy or are there other things that we enjoy more? If God is our greatest joy then should it not be He who occupies the majority of our time? "Then I will come to the altar of God, to God, my greatest joy. I will praise You with the lyre, God my God" (Psa. 43:4).

Perhaps the reason that we get the after Christmas blues is because we fail to spend time with our greatest joy, and what better way to spend time with Christ then to be daily in the Bible, and often partaking in fellowship with His body? Maybe our error is only coming to church once or twice a year. If we are to spend time with our greatest joy should we not spend time with those whom He is with? "You reveal the path of life to me; in Your presence is abundant joy; in Your right hand are eternal pleasures" (Psa. 16:11, emphasis added). There is no doubt that God's presence rests upon His body. While we can experience Christ at home, it is only as though we are looking at one puzzle piece; where if we partake with the body we get the joy of experiencing the whole picture. We have joy in knowing how our puzzle piece fits in God's great plan. This is something that individual worship cannot give. "And the disciples were filled with joy and the Holy Spirit" (Acts 13:52). While we can experience joy by ourselves, most often we see joy being experienced with other people in the Bible.





416 North High St. Cortland, Ohio 44410 ZANIN, FRANK— a US Navy World War II Veteran, a retired pipefitter, who will be remembered as a loving, giving family man, passed away on October 2, 2018 due to complications from a fall. Born July 17, 1924 in Lafferty, Ohio, Frank was a first generation American from Austria. He was the son of Vincenzo, a coal miner, and Genoveffa, a homemaker.

He was a delightful story teller. Frank's stories kept listeners either on the edge of their seats or roaring with laughter.

After high school, Frank trained to be a welder and then enlisted in the US Navy. While serving aboard the USS Murphy (DD-603), a Benson Class destroyer, he made numerous Atlantic crossings including aiding the invasion of the coast of France on D-Da. During a secret mission his ship



transported the King of Saudi Arabia to an undisclosed location for a meeting with President Franklin Roosvelt. Once home, he was the wheels man on a ship sailing the Great Lakes.

While living in Cleveland, he met and married Gloria Gay Howell. They lived many of their years in Cortland, Ohio where the two of them created and built the Cortland Playroom, a highly respected early childhood education center.

During his life in Cortland, he served as an Elder in the Cortland Christian Church as well as the "go to" guy when it came to repairs. He was also very active in the Cortland Optimist Club, where he served as Treasurer and then later as President. He retired from Packard Electric in Warren, Ohio in 1986. He and Gloria moved to Surprise, Arizona in 1998 where the two of them made numerous friends and enjoyed family time both in Ohio and Arizona. His grandchildren loved the endless ours of adventures they shared with their "Poppi".

He will be greatly missed by his daughter, Pam and her husband Rick, daughter Susan and her husband Ed, and son Frank and his wife Patrea along with his 5 grandchildren, Jessica, Travis, Patrick, Joseph and Vincent, as well as his 3 great grandchildren, Lillian, Vivian and Jack. His beloved wife of 68 years, Gloria, passed away in 2016. Frank was preceded in death by his parents; and his brother, Tulio (Dick) and sister, Anna.

A Celebration of Frank's Life was held on Sunday, October 21, 2018 AT Surprise Funeral Care, in Arizona. Frank and Gloria will be interred together, in Cortland, Ohio in the Spring of 2019.
