




The Cookie



Autumn Harvest Cookies

1 c. softened butter 1/2 c. brown sugar

1/2 c. white sugar

2 eggs

1/2 t. orange extract

1/2 t. vanilla extract

1 1/2 c. all purpose flour

1 t. baking powder

1/4 t. salt

1 t. baking powder

1 t. pumpkin pie spice

2 1/2 c. rolled oats 1/2 c. chopped walnuts 1 c. dried cranberries Preheat oven to 350 degree. Line a baking sheet with parchment paper.

Cream together butter and the brown and white sugars in a bowl until smooth. Beat in the eggs, vanilla and orange extract.

In a separate bowl, combine the flour, salt, baking powder and pumpkin pie spice; stir flour mixture into the sugar mixture. Add the oats nuts and cranberries and mix thoroughly. Using a small ice cream scoop or teaspoon, drop rounded scoops of dough onto the prepared cookie sheet.

Bake in preheated oven until the edges are golden. 8-10 minutes. Allow the cookies to cool on baking sheet for 1 minute before removing to cool.




