
Riddle 2 Removing an appendix is called an appendectomy, and removing tonsils is called a tonsillectomy. What is it called when they remove a growth from your head?







# Apostles Believer's Prayer

# Acts 4:1-31 NIV

The priests and the <u>captain</u> of the <u>temple</u> guard and the <u>Sadducees</u> came up to <u>Peter</u> and <u>John</u> while they were speaking to the people. They were greatly disturbed because the apostles were <u>teaching</u> the people and proclaiming in Jesus the resurrection of the <u>dead</u>. They <u>seized</u> Peter and John, and because it was evening, they put them in <u>jail</u> until the <u>next</u> day. But many who heard the <u>message</u> believed, and the <u>number</u> of men <u>grew</u> to about five thousand...

Then Peter, filled with the Holy Spirit, said to them: "Rulers and elders of the people! If we are being called to account today for an act of kindness shown to a cripple and are asked how he was healed, then know this, you and all the people of Israel: It is by the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth ...

When they <u>saw</u> the courage of Peter and John and realized that they were <u>unschooled</u>, <u>ordinary</u> men, they were astonished and they took note that these men had been with Jesus. But since they could see the man who had been healed standing there with them, there was nothing they could say ...

On their <u>release</u>, Peter and John went back to their own people and reported all that the chief priests and elders had said to them. When they heard this, they raised their <u>voices</u> together in prayer to God. "Sovereign Lord," they said, "you made the heaven and the earth and the sea, and everything in them. You spoke by the Holy Spirit through the mouth of your servant, our father David:

""Why do the nations rage and the peoples plot in vain? The kings of the earth take their stand and the rulers gather together against the Lord and against his Anointed One. Indeed Herod and Pontius Pilate met together with the Gentiles and the people of Israel in this city to conspire against your holy servant Jesus, whom you anointed. They did what your power and will had decided beforehand should happen. Now, Lord, consider their threats and enable your servants to speak your word with great boldness. Stretch out your hand to heal and perform miraculous signs and wonders through the name of your holy servant Jesus."

After they prayed, the place where they were meeting was shaken. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and spoke the word of God <u>boldly</u>.
