She picked up the wire & was instantly killed as the electricity shot through her little body. Laurie had never been taught that "NO" really does mean "NO".

Parents don't be afraid to be the parent so that you will not be like Laurie's parents having to deal with disaster in your family. Love your kids enough to teach them God's law and His love for them. Don't be afraid. Parenting is not for cowards, be strong and be brave.
