From the Pastor:

We proclaim to you what we have seen and heard, so that you also may have fellowship with us. And our fellowship is with the Father and with his Son, Jesus Christ. -1 John 1:3

Fellowship. As I was reading this 1st chapter of John the other day, the word *fellowship* jumped off the page at me! What an interesting word. It is not a word we commonly use in daily life. It is more of a "churchy" word. What does it mean?

According to Webster's New Collegiate Dictionary fellowship means: (a) companionship, company, associate (vb.); (b) the community of interest, activity, feeling or experience, i.e., a unified body of people of equal rank *sharing* in common interests, goals, and characteristics, etc.; (c) partnership, membership.

Today, we often view fellowship as what we do in a "fellowship" or "social" hall. It's the place where we have casual conversations and savor coffee and donuts. This is not bad and can contribute to fellowship, but it falls far short of fellowship according to biblical standards.

True church fellowship involves getting together for *spiritual* purposes: for sharing needs, for prayer, for discussing and sharing the Word to encourage, comfort, and edify one another. But it is even more.

In the New Testament, what is shared in common is shared first of all because of a common relationship that we all have together in Christ. The Greek word koinonia is used in scripture to describe this fellowship of sharing in all things because of our relationship in Christ. There is also a sense of partnership in ministry in our Christian fellowship. There is a feeling of companionship as we labor together for the Lord. And, there is the idea of stewardship together of all God has gifted us with, including talents, resources, and even our salvation.

Fellowship in Christ! What an amazing gift God has given us! It draws us closer to Christ, and closer to one another.

During May, our next series of sermons will be looking at the ancient teachings of our Church as expressed in the Apostle's Creed and where those beliefs come from in Scripture. It is important to know what we believe as Christians, and why.

Each meal has averaged 35-50 attendees, with a mix of church members and neighborhood residents. All being very appreciative and because of developing relationships, many have been asking about our church. We are always grateful and could use donations of canned spaghetti sauce, gravy, pasta and rice. Our next community meal is **Wednesday**, **May 8th at 5:30 pm** and we are looking for donations of ground beef. Being a site for the **mobile food pantry** has also been successful. Approximately 50-60 people are coming to receive food from the WNTY Food Bank the 3rd Monday of each month. Our May pantry is scheduled for **May 20**. If you would like to help, come to the church around 9:45 am.

The Pastor's Office is being transformed to accommodate mission supplies. We have a few emergency food items and clothing available in case anyone is in need. We are looking for a larger more permanent place within the building for these mission items. If they are too sticky to get off, don't fret - simply cross out your name and the name of the prescription so they are unreadable. These bottles are sent to a sterilizing plant and then shipped to third world countries for them to use to dispense medications to their people.

The **RED BIRD MISSION** in Beverly, KY, has provided ministries in the Appalachian Mountains region since 1921. Today, the need remains critical in this isolated, rural distressed area. Chronic poverty, lack of jobs, poor housing and rugged mountainous terrain provide obstacles to a fuller life for the residents of this area. Red Bird Mission strives to meet these needs through ministry in 5 areas: Education, Health & Wellness, Community Outreach, Economic Opportunity, and Community Housing Improvement. There are two different style of shoes boxes that we will be filling: adult and children.

ADULT (please indicate for MALE or FEMALE) items needed include comb/brush, shampoo, hand lotion, deodorant, toothbrush and toothpaste, chap stick, mittens, disposable razors, shaving cream, scarves, hats and mittens/gloves, nail care supplies, and socks.

CHILDREN (please indicated for BOY or GIRL w/age group of 2-4; 5-9 or 10-14 reflected) items needed include 2 or 3 toy items, 2 or 3 school items, child's toothbrush/toothpaste, shampoo, lotion, comb/brush, chap stick, scarves, hats and mittens/gloves, small flashlights, bookmarks, wristbands, etc. Christian themed trinkets are also appreciated.

PLEASE REVIEW THE FOLLOWING AS OUR PROCEDURE HAS CHANGED:

- We will provide the clear shoeboxes for distribution after services on Sundays or Pastor Jean will have some in her office.
- We will only be collecting COMPLETED shoeboxes on Sunday, November 17 (before Thanksgiving)
- Please purchase full size items. To help items fit in boxes, look for flat bottles of shampoo, lotions, etc, and small round cans of shaving cream.
- Please include \$1 for each shoebox for shipping costs. (Put money in an envelope)

Donations of shelf stable food items (canned, bottled or boxed) for the local food pantry. A collection is taken the 1st Sunday of every month.

Your donation of bottles and cans goes to our commitment for Shared Ministries.

PLEASE EMPTY AND RINSE BOTTLES AND CANS AND SEPARATE GLASS BOTTLES.

We collect only "REFUNDABLE" bottles and cans. If you prefer to redeem the bottles yourself we will happily accept your \$\$\$ donation. The bin is located by the door of the handicap entrance.
