As a people who are called to spread the Gospel, it is vital for us to be missional: to look at our world and to do our best to take the good news of Jesus Christ to it telling them about how they can find forgiveness and completeness in Jesus and what He did for us on the cross. It is for this reason that we are going to Africa in under two months (wow does time fly by)! However, being missional is much more than just reaching out to people in Africa, it is also about reaching people close to home.

That is why we are currently in the process of praying about and seeking God's will about starting a mission church in Falls City. Do we have the resources to start another church? Shane sent me a text earlier today. Do you know what is said? "I just want you to know that THIS IS AWESOME! I have never felt this GOOD before! Meeting Christie comes close, but now I know what I was missing in my life, JESUS! I know I have a long way to go, but THIS IS AWESOME!" Crazy what happens when God gets a hold of you isn't it? Now what Shane needs is someone who has been saved for awhile to partner up with him and walk him through the basics and develop some of that intimate relationship in the body I'm always telling you about. I'm going to walk with Shane on this, but what about the next person God saves? Would you pray about being willing to be the next person in line to help disciple the next person God changes? Would you let me know so I can help prepare you? Let's be missional together!!

Why am I going on the Africa mission trip? Well because it sounded cool, I didn't want to be left out, and I remember the stories Pat Traxler shared with me in great length upon his arrival home from Africa. I remember him saying the Africans are so hungry for God's word, but we here in America, we Christians have grown up many of us in the church and heard God's word over and over. It's like the teacher who speaks on the Charlie Brown cartoons, all we hear is "Waa Waa Waa, Waa Waa, Waa Waa." Translation: "Yeah yeah yeah, we already know this." We take God's words for granted, but not in Africa. They gather around God's people like they gathered around Jesus-Hungry to hear, hungry to see God revealed!

I had an initial interest, prayed about it often, and still feel confident that I am willing to go and serve in Africa. I have struggled more with the fear of being ill prepared, or frustrated because I can't prepare as I normally do for things that are important because I can't even imagine what I might see or what I may be called to do. I like to be in control, I like to be prepared, and I like results to show my success. My faith says God CAN - God WILL, but my flesh continues to try to figure and work things out rather than trusting God. If I can figure it out and control the outcome then it was all about me, and the glory is mine and not God's. ("I do not understand what I do. For what I want to do I do not do, but what I hate I do." Romans 7:15.) Instead I desire to be used of God,

to be a willing vessel, unsure of the details, and yes even the outcome or results. But I know God does not call the equipped, but rather He equips the called. If God has called me to Africa and has placed the desire in my heart to go, and if I try to get prepared and realize more and more I'm not, then I'm beginning to realize that I have nothing to offer. I can do nothing in and of myself and when I get there God will have to be God. He will have to do the work because I can't even prepare for the unknown. And my prayer is that God will fill me with His Holy Spirit to fulfill what He gives me to do.

I can relate to Moses who was lacking confidence and even qualities for what the Lord was sending him to Egypt to do. If God provided to and for Moses when he needed God's provisions, then He will do the same for me today, tomorrow, in Africa and everyday of my life....Oh that I will let go, will get ME out of the way so God can do His will in and through me for His Glory!

Let me close with saying, "Thank you Father God for making the provisions for the financial cost of Africa," God brings income opportunities our way, and God does the moving in one's heart to give generously toward the Africa trip. To those of you who responded and were used by God for Africa - Thank you and may the Lord richly bless you in return!

## Witnessing Dolls- Sewing Seeds of Kindness

Witnessing Dolls began at a conference at Ridgecrest when a missionary asked, "Does anyone know what this is?" It was a had adorned with corn husks and a feather. She explained that was what the little girls play with for baby dolls in Mali, South Africa. Years later a missionary speaker asked a group if any of them knew where Mali was and they knew because they had made the dolls she had passed out years before to the little girls in the village. This ministry has now grown and is being used as a project for churches in many different states.

Robin Reeves was launched into a new ministry by God when she opened two boxes of dolls from the North American Mission Board. She enlisted the help of about 30 women and they created 470 dolls for a missionary to take to Nicaragua. Since this "Sewing Seeds for Kindness" began they have sent over 1000 dolls to 15 states and 5 countries.

Reeves has been amazed by the way God has used the witnessing dolls and has made it the primary focus of her ministry. She said, "I never dreamed God would use something as simple as fabric, yarn, and sewing supplies to multiply His Kingdom and bless others the way he has." Ecclesiastes 9:10 says, "Whatever your hands find to do, do it with all your might." We are not only sewing with our hands, but we're also sowing seeds for Christ. What an awesome God we serve.

When our WMU group decided to construct their dolls for our team that is going to South Africa, Terri Porter, Charlene Anderson's daughter, our angel said she had some spare time and would cut out and sew together our dolls for us. Oh what a blessing and gift that was to us as we were going to send approximately 100 dolls! After cutting them out and sewing them together (and believe me that is not an easy chore), she went them back to us for the finishing touches. A group of WMU members and a part of the team going to South Africa who are continually telling me that they have no talent gathered together and put the finishing touches to the dolls which turned out to be beautiful. The prayers on our hearts when we finished the dolls were that they would touch the hearts of those children and change lives. A big thank you to all who were involved in the construction of these witnessing dolls and getting them ready to send to South Africa.

Please pray for God to use the witnessing dolls to reveal His plan of salvation through His son, Jesus Christ, to people throughout the world. ~LaVon Johnson
