MONSTERS IN YOUR CHILDREN'S CLOSET?

Childhood Fears

A Christian father was putting his 7-year-old daughter to bed one night when she told him she was afraid of the monsters in her closet. The father prayed for her and asked God what he wanted the girl to know about the monsters but she said, "Daddy, God isn't talking to me." Her father wisely asked her if she was angry at anyone, and she admitted that she was angry at her mother for not allowing her to invite her best friend to her birthday party.

Her father explained, "When you have anger in your heart it is like having ear plugs in your ears so you can't hear God. Do you want to get rid of your anger?" She said that she did so he led her in a prayer and she told God why she was angry and asked Him to take it from her. Immediately, her anger left her.

The Cause of Fears

The father then prayed again and asked God what He wanted her to know about the monsters. This time she said, "God said that monsters are not real, but if they were, He is stronger than them." She said that she was no longer afraid but felt peaceful and she rolled over and said, "Good night, daddy!" Her father gave her a hug and a kiss and told her "good night."

This father understood that the Lord is able to take away our anger and fears. When he prayed for his daughter, the Lord spoke truth to her to set her free from her fears, just as Jesus said when He spoke about the Holy Spirit who "will guide you into all the truth." Fears are usually based upon irrational beliefs (lies) and this father knew that God can set us free from them through prayer. Her fears suddenly disappeared when the Lord spoke truth into her heart.

Adults Have Fears, Too

One day Jesus and his disciples got into a boat to cross the sea, and He laid down and went to sleep. A storm arose and the waves began to spill into the boat, so his disciples became fearful. They woke him up and said, "Teacher, do you not care that we are perishing?" Jesus stood up and rebuked the wind and said, "Peace, be still" (Mark 5:39). The wind died down and became calm and He removed all of their fears.

The disciples were afraid because they believed the lies that Jesus was just a good teacher, He didn't care about their problems, and they were all going to die. Fears are based upon **false beliefs** such as: "Something terrible is going to happen; I'm going to die; he is going to return and hurt me again." You cannot easily talk people out of these beliefs but God is able to replace false beliefs with His truth to set us free (John 8:32).

Finding the Source

There are many different types of fears. Some people have a fear of water, a fear of storms, a fear of heights, a fear of speaking in a group, a fear of dying, or a generalized fear. Fears develop at a point in time when something scary happens to you and then the strong feelings become connected in your mind to specific sights or sounds around you. When these same sights and sounds recur, they reawaken the original fear and it feels like it is happening again.

In order to release these fears, you must: 1) Identify the original source of your fear, 2) Identify the false belief that you believe, and then 3) Pray for the Lord to bring you truth. Jesus said, "You shall know the truth, and the truth shall set you free" (John 8:32), and this is what happens when we pray for truth about some fear.

Overcoming Anger

Fears are easily removed when the Lord speaks truth into your mind, but anger prevents God from hearing your prayers. Children may be angry at their parents but God wants to take away their anger so they will obey them and honor them. Here are two simple steps to getting rid of anger that prevents us from hearing God's voice of truth.

STEP ONE: Be honest with God by making a list of the reasons for your anger toward one person.

STEP TWO: Pray and ask the Lord to take your anger from you.

Finding True Peace

When you pray and listen quietly, the Lord can speak to your heart through His "still, small voice," and He will bring thoughts to your mind and replace the lies you believe with His truth. When this happens, you will be "set free indeed." If the thoughts that come into your mind when you pray like this come from your own mind, they will not set you free. Or, if you have negative thoughts that you know are not from the Lord, then command the devil, in the name of Jesus, to leave you alone and pray again. The Bible tells us in 2 Timothy 1:7, "God has not given us a spirit of fear, but of power and love and discipline." This Halloween, teach your children how to overcome their fears so they can have peace in their heart.



Disaster Relief has been really busy the last month or so. Joe Skinner has led 2 groups and Jim Smith has led a group.
