Time alone with the Father. As we consider how we might live, love, look, listen to and sound like Jesus in 2022,

let's take a look at Jesus' priority and habits. **Luke 22:39** says, "Jesus went out as usual to the Mount of Olives, and His disciples followed Him." The New King James Version puts it this way, "He went to the Mount of Olives, as He was accustomed..." In other words, "as was His habit." And the primary reason Jesus went to the Mount of Olives was to pray and hear from His Heavenly Father.

God desires for His children to develop "holy habits" like this. Jesus modeled the best way to live for us. Prayer wasn't an afterthought or last resort – it was a way of life – a "rule of life." Jesus spent hours everyday communicating with His Father. He took the time to be still and listen to what the Father had to say to Him. He "waited upon the Lord."

By the grace of God I am what I am, and his grace toward me was not in vain. On the contrary, I worked harder than any of them, though it was not I, but the grace of God that is with me. (1 Corinthians 15:10)

Grace is not only God's *disposition* to do good for us when we don't deserve it. It is an actual *power* from God that *acts* and makes good things happen *in* us and *for* us.

God's grace was God's acting in Paul to make Paul work hard: "By the grace of God... I worked harder than any of them." So when Paul says, "Work out your own salvation," he adds, "for it is God who works in you, both to will and to work for his good pleasure" (Philippians 2:12—13). Grace is power from God to do good things in us and for us.

This grace is past and it is future. It is ever-cascading over the infinitesimal waterfall of the present, from the inexhaustible river of grace coming to us from the future, into the ever-increasing reservoir of grace in the past.

In the next five minutes, you will receive sustaining grace flowing to you from the future, and you will accumulate another five minutes' worth of grace in the reservoir of the past. The proper response to the grace you experienced in the past is *thankfulness*, and the proper response to grace promised to you in the future is *faith*. We are *thankful* for the past grace of the last year, and we are *confident* in the future grace for the new year.

#### The only thing that matters is what you do.

A good intention that is never acted upon is worth nothing in God's Kingdom. What matters to Jesus is the <u>action</u> we take in the form of the help and support we give to those in need.

Be devoted to one another in love. Honor one another above yourselves. Romans 12:10

#### Don't let labels fool you.

Actions speak louder than any label, so don't judge a person by their title or appearance. People are not always who they seem to be.

Watch out for false prophets. They come to you in sheep's clothing, but inwardly they are ferocious wolves. Matthew 7:15 Don't search for a reward.

When there's something in it for you, your actions aren't in the spirit of the Good Samaritan message. The best reward that comes from helping someone when there's nothing in it for you is knowing that your actions are pleasing to God by caring for His people.
